## RECORD OF THE MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE BEAUMONT CHERRY VALLEY WATER DISTRICT

#### **September 12, 2007**

#### 1. Call to Order, Pledge of Allegiance, Invocation and Roll Call - President Parks

President Parks called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m., 1210 Beaumont Ave, Beaumont, California. Those responding to roll call were Directors Parks, Ball, Chatigny, Dopp and Lash. Also present were the General Manager C.J. Butcher, District Engineer Joe Reichenberger and Legal Counsel Gerald Shoaf. Director Lash led the pledge and Vice President Ball recited the invocation.

#### 2. Adoption and Adjustment of Agenda (additions and/or deletions)

General Manager Butcher requested the addition of the following items: Resolution 2007-03 as item 5b and discussion and possible action to authorize staff to publish potential alternative to mitigate sewering costs to sewer Cherry Valley in the local newspaper as item 3.

Vice-President Ball suggested moving the Closed Session (item 3) to the end of the Board meeting as item 11.

Director Dopp moved to add Resolution 2007-03 as item 5b, discussion and possible action to authorize staff to publish potential alternative to mitigate sewering costs to sewer Cherry Valley in the local newspaper as item 3 and move the Closed Session to item 11. The motion was unanimously approved.

### 3. <u>Discussion and Possible Action to Approve Staff to Publish Potential Alternative to Mitigate Sewering Costs to Sewer Cherry Valley in the Local Newspaper.</u>

General Manager Butcher reported that he took part in a discussion regarding possible ways to mitigate the costs of sewering Cherry Valley with Vice President Ball and ratepayer Glen Stull following the Town Hall meeting held at the Civic Center. General Manager Butcher briefly described the groundwater pollution control project. The project would consist in putting a series of wells across the areas of Little San Gorgonio Creek and Noble Creek. The polluted water could then be taken to the non-potable system and used for irrigation or it could be pumped to the artificial wetlands in Bogart Park. The project, if determined to be viable, could allow the sewering project to be placed on hold and the cost could be distributed amongst all of the water users of the District.

The Bureau of Reclamation has expressed an interest in the project and may wish to contribute as much as 25% of the cost. Grants through the State of California Proposition 84 funding may be available as well as the newest water bond which is currently being discussed in the Legislature. Legal Counsel Shoaf requested the board authorize staff to send a press release to the local media.

Director Dopp moved to publish this new option in the local newspaper to inform the public. President Parks seconded. The motion failed by the following roll call vote:

### 4. <u>Verbal Presentation by Joe Reichenberger Regarding the Status of Groundwater Storage Account.</u>

District Engineer Reichenberger reported that Vice President Ball requested this item originally discussed at the August 22, 2007 regular meeting be placed on the agenda for the September meeting for further discussion by the Board.

District Engineer Reichenberger reviewed figures on the graph as requested by Vice President Ball. He noted that the District reports differed from the Watermaster Reports as the District operates and reports on a calendar year while the Watermaster operates and reports on a fiscal year.

Vice President Ball further questioned a column that shows Overlyers unused water which would be redistributed to the Appropriators and asked if there would be a cost. Chief of Watermaster Service J. Andrew Schlange replied that there would be no cost. He also explained that according to the Judgment, the redistribution is to the advantage of the appropriators like South Mesa Mutual Water Company, Beaumont Cherry Valley Water District, Yucaipa Valley Water District, and the City of Banning. He further explained that if an Overlyer pumps more than their allocation, the Overlyer would be required to pay an assessment to the Watermaster for the amount of water pumped in excess of their individual entitlement. Mr. Schlange reported that the Watermaster's Fiscal Year begins on July 1<sup>st</sup> and ends on June 30<sup>th</sup> of the following year.

On another issue, Vice President Ball stated that the Board had requested a document that states that the District has the right to sell recycled water from the Beaumont wastewater treatment plant. Mr. Reichenberger explained that there is no specific document stating that the District has the right to distribute and sell recycled water. Rather, it is implied in the way that the agreement is written. A letter was requested from the City Manager which states that Beaumont Cherry Valley Water District has the right to sell recycled water.

President Parks invited Luwana Ryan to address the Board. Ms. Ryan, a Cherry Valley resident and ratepayer, stated that she went through the MOU's in the 2005 UWMP and no where in the documents does it state the cost of recycled water to the District or the ratepayers. She also stated that she went to the city and asked the city for a copy of the Ordinance and she was told that the city was in the process of rescinding it.

A discussion ensued regarding the District not having an available recycled water supply at this time as stated in the 2005 UWMP. The discussion included the status of funds paid to the City of Beaumont for planning and construction of the boosters systems at the Wastewater Treatment Plant. Board members asked if the District is in the process of getting an agreement. Staff replied that only when the District is ready will recycled water be requested.

Vice President Ball moved to request an update on the Recycle System Project. Director Dopp seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

#### 5. Action Items

#### a) Approval of Facility Fee Outlined in Raftelis Financial Report.

No action needed as the Facility Fee Outline in the Raftelis Financial report was approved at the July 11<sup>th</sup>, 2007 Board Meeting.

b) Resolution and Possible Action to Approve and Sign Resolution 2007-03, Renaming and Increasing the District's Capacity Charges (Formerly Facilities Fees) Pursuant to Government Code Section 66013 St. SEQ.

Director Lash moved to approved and sign Resolution 2005-03. Director Chatigny seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

c) <u>San Gorgonio Pass Agency's Letter Inviting Beaumont Cherry Valley Water District to Joint Meetings.</u>

Director Dopp moved to accept invitation from the San Gorgonio Pass Water Agency to set up joint meetings. Vice President Ball seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

#### 6. Public Input

President Parks invited Luwan Ryan to address the Board. Ms. Ryan stated she would wait for item 9 on the agenda.

#### 7. Adoption of Minutes

Minutes of the Regular Meeting August 22, 2007

It was suggested to change item 6a to read "requested motion to approve District to seek" instead of "requested motion to procreate funding."

Director Chatigny moved to approve the minutes with corrections. Director Lash seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

#### 8. General Manager's Report

- a) Vineland III Tank Vineland III tank is completed and ready to go on-line pending the results of one more water sample.
- b) Wells, 25, 26 & 29 All three wells are under construction, Well 26 is nearing completion. The footings and flooring for the control rooms are done.

General Manager Butcher stated that the new building is still on schedule to be completed by Christmas 2007.

#### 9. Finance and Audit Committee Report

No action was taken.

#### 10. Announcement.

President Parks announced that the Breakfast Conference is on Thursday, September 20, 2007, and that the Manager of SAWPA will be presenting.

Vice-President Ball announced that there were a couple of classes regarding The Brown Act and the California's Water Town Hall meeting on September 20<sup>th</sup> at 6:00pm in Riverside.

#### 11. Closed Session

Adjourn to Closed Session: 8:45 p.m. Return from Closed Session: 10:30 p.m.

Legal Counsel Shoaf announced that in connection with the litigation, BCVWD v. City of Calimesa, Counsel Scott Heil reported that the trial court denied the District's Motion for Summary Judgment which was based on statutes indicating that the District has the right to put waterlines in the City's street without an encroachment permit, but granted the City's Motion for Summary Judgment which was based on the claim that the District is a "municipal corporation" which, the Public Utilities Code requires to obtain an encroachment permit under the circumstances. Counsel Heil recommended that the ruling be appealed, and by 5-0 vote, the Board authorized the appeal.

Legal Counsel Shoaf gave a status report regarding the potential litigation; the Board took no action other than to continue the discussion of the matter in a closed session on September 26<sup>th</sup>, 2007.

#### 12. Adjournment

President Parks adjourned the meeting to Wednesday, September 26, 2007 at 7:00 p.m. to be held at District's Facility located on the Southeast corner of 12<sup>th</sup> Street and Palm Avenue (815 E. 12<sup>th</sup> Street).

#### **September 26, 2007**

#### 1. Call to Order, Pledge of Allegiance, Invocation and Roll Call - President Parks

President Parks called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m., 815 E. 12<sup>th</sup> Street, Beaumont, California. Those responding to roll call were Directors Parks, Ball, Chatigny, Dopp, and Lash. Also present were the General Manager, C.J. Butcher and Legal Counsel Gerald Shoaf. Director Lash led the pledge and Vice President Ball recited the invocation.

#### 2. Adoption and Adjustment of Agenda (additions and/or deletions)

Director Chatigny moved to adopt the Agenda as presented. Director Dopp seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

#### 3. Public Input

President Parks invited Steve Rose to address the Board. Mr. Rose, a Cherry Valley resident and ratepayer, stated that the sewering project was not a good idea. Mr. Rose read a study from the State University of New York, Department of Geosciences, which states that nitrates stay in the ground for 30 years. The sewering project, in his opinion, is not the solution. The General Manager, Charles Butcher, informed the public that Measure B had failed and that the District would not be submitting an application to activate the District's latent sewer powers.

President Parks invited Pat Doherty to address the Board. Mr. Doherty, a Cherry Valley Resident and ratepayer, read portions of studies made by Doctors at the University of California which show that the studies of 1974 are outdated. He stated that Mrs. Davis (Wildermuth Environmental Inc.) based her studies on this report. He stated that these same studies have proven that Blue Baby Syndrome is not caused by nitrates.

President Parks invited Frances Flanders to address the Board. Ms. Flanders, a Cherry Valley resident and ratepayer, stated that new items should not placed on an adjourned agenda and to do so would be a violation of the Brown Act. Ms. Flanders further reported that the agenda had to be posted on the door of the location where the meeting is being held in order to be compliant with the Brown Act. She cautioned the Board to be very careful when approving a Consent Calendar as it limits public input on the items.

Legal Counsel, Gerald Shoaf reported to the Board they were compliant with Brown Act when adding items to an adjourned meeting. Mr. Shoaf also stated that the public was informed of both the meeting and the agenda and again was in compliance with the Brown Act.

#### 4. Action Items (Discussion and Possible Action)

President Parks invited Luwana Ryan to address the Board. Ms. Ryan, a Cherry Valley resident and ratepayer, urged the Board to review the Directors' Reimbursement Policy before accepting it. She commented that the policy has to be more specific when requesting reimbursement for travel expenses, especially if the Director's spouse travels with the claimant.

#### a) Board of Directors Reimbursement Policy.

Legal Counsel Shoaf and General Manager Butcher suggested the Board review the Reimbursement Policy and submit their comments no later than Wednesday, October 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2007. The comments will be presented at the next regular meeting. No action was taken.

WHEREAS, the Beaumont Cherry Valley Water District (hereafter "District") owns and operates a recycled water distribution system including pipelines, pump stations and reservoirs; and

WHEREAS, the District plans to complete the necessary facilities to distribute recycled water from the City of Beaumont's water reclamation plant; and

WHEREAS, this Board of Directors authorized the General

Manager/Secretary/Treasurer to apply for a State Revolving Fund (SRF) loan to fund
a portion of the needed facilities to complete the backbone recycled water
transmission system including a pump station and storage reservoirs; and

WHEREAS, the SRF loan program guidelines require the preparation and submittal of a recycled water revenue program, and

WHEREAS, the recycled water revenue program must illustrate that the District will have adequate financial resources to repay the SRF loan; and

WHEREAS, the recycled water revenue program must illustrate that the District will reserve some of its financial resources for future expansion, major repair or replacement costs; and

WHEREAS, in order to qualify for a SRF loan the District must dedicate a capital reserve fund.

WHEREAS, the District has established a depreciation account for infrastructure facilities and funds the depreciation through the water rate;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Beaumont Cherry Valley Water District that:

1. A portion of the District's existing depreciation account will be set aside as a Recycled Water Capital Reserve fund.

- 2. Funds shall beset aside and pledged to the Recycled Water Capital Reserve Fund at an annual rate of one-half of one percent (0.5%) of the SRF loan amount for a period of ten (10) years.
- 3. Interest earned on deposits in the Recycled Water Capital Reserve Fund shall accrue to and remain on deposit in the Recycled Water Capital Reserve Fund.
- 4. Funds deposited in or accruing to the Recycled Water Capital Reserve Fund shall be available for expansion, major repair, or replacement of the recycled water facilities.
- 5. Funds expended from the Recycled Water Capital Reserve Fund shall be replaced by depositing at a minimum annual rate of ten percent (10%) of the amount expended.
- 6. The General Manager/Secretary/Treasurer is hereby directed to prepare and submit to the State Water Resources Control Board; Division of Financial Assistance, a report on the Recycled Water Capital Reserve Fund activities and fund status beginning five (5) years after the completion of construction of the project funded with the proceeds of the SRF loan. Updated reports will be prepared and submitted every five (5) years thereafter until the loan is discharged.
- 7. The requirements, herein shall remain in force for the life of the SRF loan contract.

Water Quality in the Beaumont Basin (Measure "B")

STWMA Project Committee 1 was formed to study among other water resource issues, the water quality problems that the District is experiencing in wells located in and adjacent to the Cherry Valley (CV) area. A study undertaken by Wildermuth Environmental Inc. (WEI) concluded that nitrate contamination and Personal Care Products (PCPs) were leaching into the groundwater from the CV area's on-site waste disposal systems (septic tanks). The study further determined that there would be continuing and increasing damage to the groundwater areas serving the District if this method of waste disposal was to continue.

In an effort to address the problem, the District's Board of Directors approved the research and development of plans for mitigating this groundwater pollution problem. The planning process included application for a California State Revolving Fund Ioan, which required development of system and financing plans for a possible sewer collection and treatment system, as well as other possible options (10 options were being reviewed) for dealing with the ever growing pollution. As part of the overall planning process, the District made application to the Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO) to activate its latent sewer authority. To activate the dormant sewer power the District was required to have a District wide election to determine if the registered voters would authorize the continuation of the LAFCO application. The measure (Measure "B") was set for a September 25, 2007 Special Measure Mail Ballot Election. Attached is the certified notification showing that Measure "B" failed to gain approval.

With the failure of Measure "B" the LAFCO application and the SRF loan application can not move forward, which eliminates the District's ability to plan for the eventual sewering of the septic tank area.

Below is the total BCVWD cost to date for the Water Quality Study and the SRF sewering loan application cost. Measure "B" costs are included in number one below (As requested, a breakdown of Measure B costs will be included in the November Audit and Finance Committee Meeting), which included formation of STWMA Project Committee 1 (STWMA PC 1).

1. Cherry Valley Septic Tank study (Measure B totals included)

\$359,384.05

2. SRF loan for sewering CVCOI

\$386,847.92

With the failure of Measure "B" the District must consider what other options there might be, if any, to control or deal with the growing pollution problems in the Cherry Valley area.

#### **Well 16 Nitrate Sampling**

Because of the pollution problems underlying the Cherry Valley area, Wells 16 and 21 are currently being sampled weekly, to monitor the nitrates that are leaching into the wells water supply from the area's on-site waste disposal systems. A regular weekly water sample from well 16 was taken on the 21<sup>st</sup> of September, which showed an increase in nitrate to 40 mg/l. The following week the sample showed nitrate levels had returned to the 10 mg/l to 15 mg/l, which is where they had been, since the cession of State Project Water recharge at the Cherry Valley debris basin site, near the CV fire station.

It appears that the spike could be associated with a recent rainfall event that occurred in early September, when approximately 1.5 inches of rain fell in the canyon areas (Little San G. and Noble). The return to lower levels would seem to confirm this as a possibility.

I suggest that the Board of Directors set a date for a Special Meeting of the Board or a Workshop, where the Board can receive reports from the District Engineer, Groundwater Consultants and STWMA PC 1 Engineer about potential impacts, and associated alternatives, since sewering the area is no longer available as a remedy.

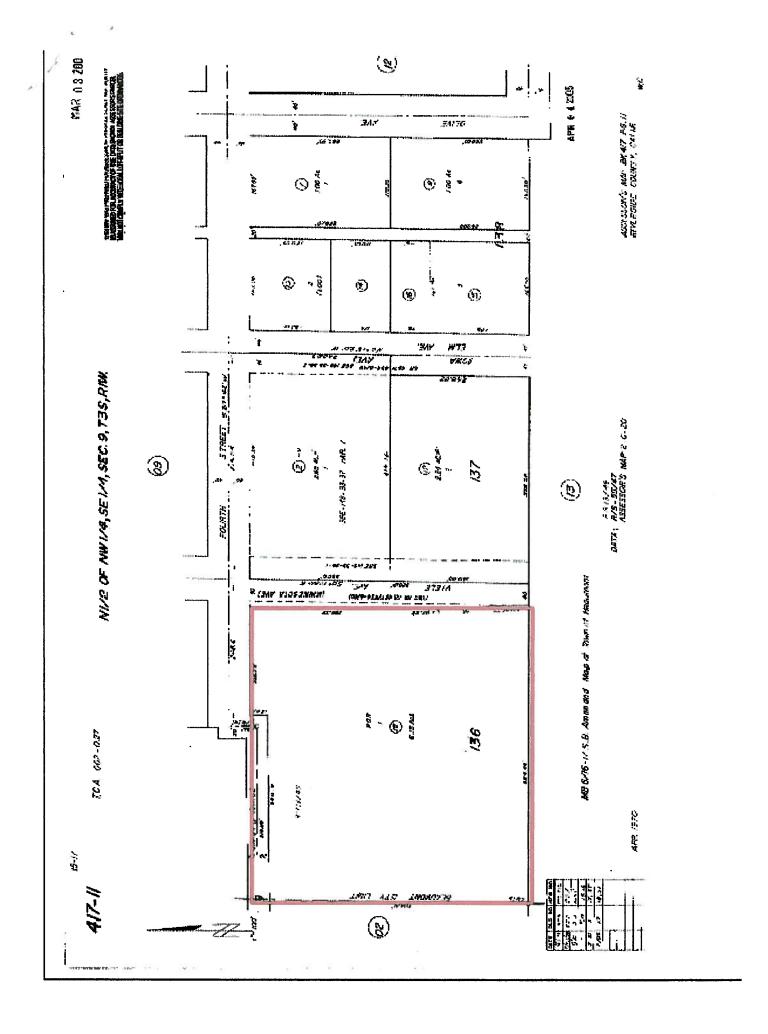

# ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE BEAUMONT-CHERRY VALLEY WATER DISTRICT PROVIDING FOR COMPENSATION OF MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE BEAUMONT-CHERRY VALLEY WATER DISTRICT, RIVERSIDE COUNTY, CALIFORNIA, DOES ORDAIN as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> <u>Purpose.</u> This Ordinance is enacted pursuant to Section 20200 et seq. of the Water Code of California.

Each Director shall receive \$200.00 compensation per day for each day's service rendered at meetings or events specified in the Policy Statement entitled "Board Member's Compensation and Expense Reimbursement" adopted this same date and as amended from time to time, not exceeding a total of ten (10) days in any calendar month.

THE FOREGOING ORDINANCE was introduced at a meeting of the Board of Directors of the Beaumont-Cherry Valley Water District held on October 10, 2007, following a public hearing, notice of which was published in the Record Gazette. This Ordinance takes effect 60 days from and after the date of its passage.

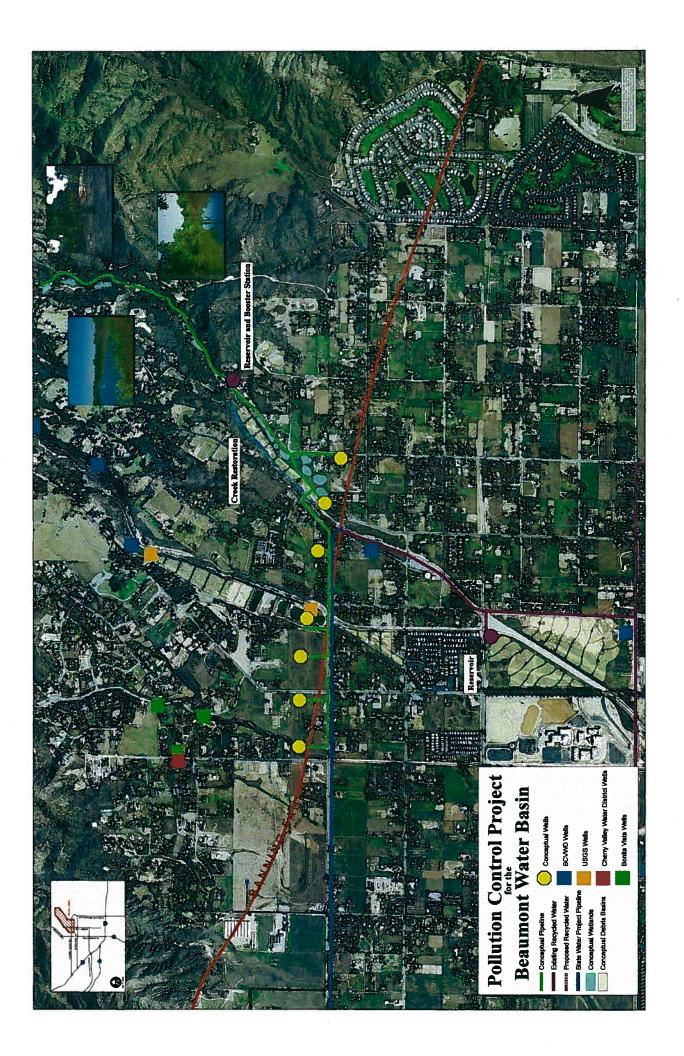

He has also made a presentation concerning the facility plans to the citizen committee that includes Directors Parks and Lash, as well as members of the Pass Agency Board, Parks and Open Space District, BCV Recreation and Parks District and CVAN members.
- 2. What is Mayer Hoffman and McCann's invoice for?

  Answer: It is for services received in preparation of the 2004 Audit
- Why is Nino's check cancelled and not reissued?

- 4. Why are Bryan Wilfley's school supplies paid for before successful completion of a class?

**Answer:** The BCVWD agreement with Bryan includes payment of costs when incurred.

5. Is Joe Reichenberger on the District Payroll?

- 6. Why is BCVWD paying Mr. Schlange full wages? Answer: Mr. Schlange is the manager of the STWMA PC 1 committee. BCVWD is Treasurer of that committee. 50% of Mr. Schlange's work is paid by the City of Beaumont by separate BCVWD invoice
- 7. Why is Bereavement/School/Jury Duty over budget?

  Answer: There were incorrect entries made to this action. Because of my other duties I was unable to review the month end and Quarterly reports until after the Audit Committee meeting. Errors were corrected before the Board meeting agendas were sent out.
- 8. Committee would like Lara Landscape and Tom Lara invoices separated for Recharge Facility work based on phases 1 & 2.

  Answer: There has been no phase 2 landscape work completed.
- Committee requested a report that shows all cash received for the month of September.
   Answer: 472 page Cash Receipts report will be provided at the meeting.
- 10. Committee requests the Board decide which invoices can be approved without review of the Audit Committee.Answer: Requires Board action.
- 11. Audit Committee requests a "Payroll" report.

  Answer: Attached is a salary summary. "Payroll" reports include Social Security and other sensitive information that must be kept private as it is an invasion of an employees privacy to expose some of the data contained therein. Examples: State and Federal Income tax withheld and Deferred Compensation. Legal Counsel will provide additional information in a verbal report.
- 12. Questions related to Scott invoices, there is a concern that there may be double billing occurring.

**Employment Status of the District Engineer** 

Chuck, I understand some members of the Board had questions about my employment status as the District Engineer. This memo summarizes my hiring and other issues related to my employment.

In middle to late October 2006, I told Chuck Butcher that I was retiring from Parsons Corporation effective November 10, 2006. Parsons was under contract to the District to provide the District Engineer and other support engineering functions since the early 1980s. Mr. Reichenberger served as the District Engineer, through Parsons, since that time. As such Mr. Reichenberger was a consultant and was billed to the District at Parsons' standard billing rate for his classification and experience - I believe it was about \$160 per hour.

I also told Chuck, that I offered to continue to work for Parsons on the same basis that I had been since 1993, (casual, hourly status), when I took a full time academic position. Parsons senior management stated that it was against their policy to hire back employees who had retired and took their accrued ESOP shares. I told Chuck I would like to continue to work for the District and could do it either as a consultant or a part time employee. We both agreed that it would be better for both of us if I were an employee.

On November 8, 2006, in closed session, the hiring of Mr. Reichenberger was discussed in the full presence of the Board. During the Closed Session my qualifications, potential employment, etc. were discussed. There were no objections. When we came out of closed session my recollection is that an announcement was made that I was hired as District Engineer. My hourly rate at the time of hire was \$100 per hour – 38% less than the District was paying Parsons.

On November 15, 2006, I formally filled out my paperwork for employment, including all "right to work" paperwork and this is considered my first day of employment.

My status is "part time." I am not under the employee SEIU agreement. I receive a W-2 each year just like every other employee. There is withholding, FICA, Medicare, SDI etc. taken out of each paycheck.

I have a full time job under a University contract from August 15<sup>th</sup> through May 15<sup>th</sup> of the following year. The University allows me 1 day a week off campus so I have one day a week for District activities (Wednesdays) during the school year; during winter break and summers, I have more time available and have been spending about 3 days a week at the District office.

I fill out a time sheet each week designating the work that I do; some is reimbursable from developers; some is chargeable to capital projects; some is general engineering. I charge for the actual hours worked, even if it is more than 8 hours in a single day. I get paid "straight time" for every hour worked. Since I am requested to do work away from the District office, e.g., evaluations, plan reviews etc., I will charge time for these activities.

I am a member of PERS and have about 16 years of service through my tenure on the San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District Board of Directors. Since I am a new employee, according to the District's current policy, I have to pay a share of the PERS contribution. I have medical insurance through the San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District (ACWA Group) so I don't take medical or dental or other benefits from the District. Since I am now 65 years old, I am also covered by Medicare Part A. I have dental and vision coverage from the University.

I don't accrue any vacation or sick leave credit. I charge for a holiday if it is a regular work day for me. I do not participate in the District's deferred compensation program, though I may decide to do this at some point. However, this is really at little or no cost to the District, since it is my money that is put into the program.

I have District cell phone which I use for District business; I have a personal cell phone that I use for personal and University business.

When I work at home or the University on District business, I use my own personal equipment – computer, fax etc.

I personally pay for the renewal fees on my California PE license and the California T5 water treatment plant operator license. The latter has significant continuing education requirements which I pay myself. The District benefits from this at no cost.

I am a life member of AWWA and, as such, pay no dues; when I go to AWWA or ACWA conferences, the cost of registration, meals, lodging etc. is paid by the San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District. BCVWD benefits from my participation in these activities as well as my involvement, as President of the Board of Directors, with the San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District – one of the State Water Project Contractors.

I trust this should answer any questions the Board or the public may have about my employment status.

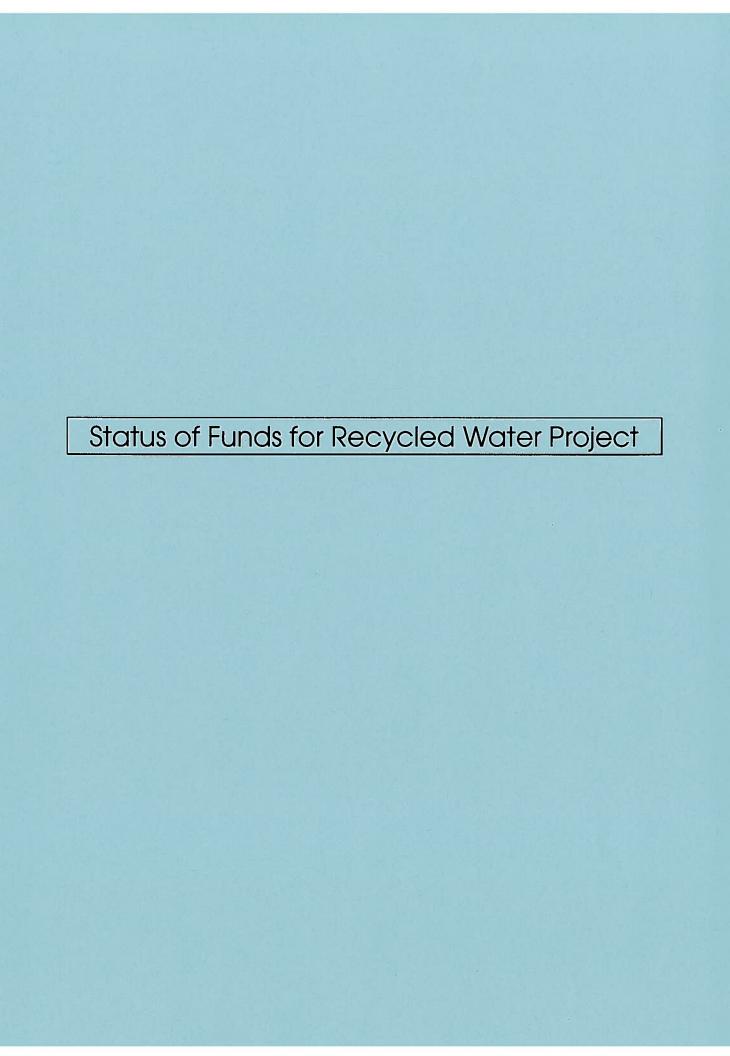

Urban Water Management Plan 2005 Update

Directive to Include Specific Recycled Water MOU

At the Board Meeting on September 12, 2007, there was a question raised by Director Ball and some members of the public relative to whether Parsons' had followed through with a Board directive that required adding a specific MOU in the Urban Water Management Plan 2005 Update (UWMP) as a condition of approval.

The UWMP, Appendix O, contains comment letters, District responses and copies of the minutes of the Board meetings of December 14, 2005, December 28, 2005, and January 28, 2006. The latter meeting was when the UWMP was adopted.

Quoting from the minutes of January 28, 2006:

"Luwana Ryan: In the draft, section 8-2, at the bottom of the page, in Appendix, it states the City is responsible for water usage and invoicing for recycled water, is that true?

Mr. Butcher: Good catch Luwana, the City is not responsible, it will be the District's responsibility. We need to include in the MOU with the City that the City will be giving the system back to the District."

The UWMP Appendices contain the following documents:

- APPENDIX C -- Cooperative Agreement between the City of Beaumont and the Beaumont Cherry Valley Water District - March 8, 1993. This Agreement set forth interim fess and clearly defined the BCVWD as the constructor of the recycled water system; required the City to establish a reclaimed water use ordinance; and directed the City Manager and BCVWD to negotiate and prepare a reclaimed water purchase agreement.
- APPENDIX H -- Joint Financing Agreement between the City of Beaumont Community Facilities District No 93-1 and Beaumont Cherry Valley Water District - June 29, 1993. This Agreement set up the "ground rules" under which the Community Facilities District would finance the necessary facilities identified in the 1993 Cooperative Agreement.

- APPENDIX E Implementation Memorandum of Understanding Relating to Cooperative Agreement between the City of Beaumont and the Beaumont Cherry Valley Water District —March 1998. This Implementation Memorandum gave the City of Beaumont the authority to construct and operate the recycled water system.
- APPENDIX I -- Amended and Restated Joint Financing Agreement between the City of Beaumont Community Facilities District No 93-1 and Beaumont Cherry Valley Water District -- December 1, 1999. This Agreement amended the June 29, 1993 Joint Financing Agreement. BCVWD facilities for water reclamation were identified.
- APPENDIX E --Memorandum of Understanding, Recycled Water System Delivery Project for Oak Valley Champions November 22, 2002 and revised March 4, 2003. This Memorandum rescinded the March 1998 Implementation Memorandum, and memorializes the fact that BCVWD levies and collects fees from private developers for a recycled water fee and advanced \$360,000 to the City of Beaumont for facilities and equipment to facilitate the delivery of recycled water to the project (to partially fund the planning, design and construction of storage, pumping and other facilities at the treatment plant and directed the City to expand their wastewater treatment plant.

#### Conclusion:

In the Board Meeting January 28, 2006 Minutes, the MOU referenced by Mr. Butcher was the *Memorandum of Understanding, Recycled Water System Delivery Project for Oak Valley Champions – November 22, 2002 and revised March 4, 2003* which rescinded the March 1998 agreement and gave the recycled water system back to the District. This <u>was</u> included in Appendix E of the UWMP in accordance with the Board's directive.

#### **Additional Comments:**

The City of Beaumont's NPDES permit (wastewater discharge permit) has effluent limits based on two scenarios: 1) maximum benefit objectives, 2) non-degradation objectives. The non-degradation objectives are very stringent and would require the City to desalt their wastewater effluent before discharging it. This would result in a substantial cost to construct and operate a reverse osmosis desalting system. But the cost of the desalter is only a part of the cost. A brine line would have to be extended down to the current terminus of the Santa Ana Regional Interceptor (SARI Line) in Colton.

So for financial reasons and because it will benefit the basin water supply, the City committed to specific requirements which included use of recycled water for direct irrigation uses and the use of recycled water for recharge. Their permit states specifically that if these projects are not implemented, the Regional Board will mandate the more-stringent non-degradation objectives.

Their waste discharge permit states:

"BCVWD will take all of the recycled water that is available and blend it with untreated State Project Water. BCVWD will then deliver this water for irrigation to Oak Valley Golf Course, Highland Springs North Golf Course, PGA Oak Valley Golf Courses, SunnyCal Egg Ranch and for irrigation of parkways, medians, cemeteries and parks."

Consequently the City has no choice but to work with the BCVWD to implement the recycled water project.

This is further confirmed in the MOU between the City and BCVWD entitled "Memorandum of Understanding and Statement of Cooperation between the City of Beaumont and the Beaumont Cherry Valley Water District," January 30, 2007 signed by Board President Parks. (This is the MOU in which the City and BCVWD were to negotiate the eventual transfer of the City's wastewater system by BCVWD.)

This MOU states "The City's sewer system will soon be producing Recycled Water which could be utilized by the District to reduce the demand for potable water for non-potable (e.g. irrigation) and recharge purposes."

So it is abundantly clear that BCVWD will be the recycled water distributor. The fact that the City has a financial need to implement the "maximum benefit objectives" makes it essentially mandatory they work with the District in this regard.
