3. Consideration of Participation in a Facilitated Process for Resolution of Regional Water Issues with San Bernardino Valley Municipal Water District.** (pages 34-36)

General Manager Fraser gave an overview of the invitation received from the San Bernardino Valley Municipal Water District to participate in a facilitated process to discuss regional water supply issues of mutual interest in the Pass area.

After discussion, all Directors thanked the SBVMWD and agreed to table the item until the next Board meeting. Director Covington motioned to table the item and bring back in the May Board meeting. The motion was seconded by Director Douglass and passed 4-0, with President Cottrell absent.

4. Consideration of Request for Update of "Will Serve Letter" for Previously Approved Development – Tract 32850.** (pages 37-41)

Public comment on Item:

Mr. Dan Haskins, representative for Land Engineering Consultants Inc., explained the tract's engineering design challenges the owner and developer have been resolving since the last Updated Will Serve Letter dated June 2015. Mr. Haskins is requesting on behalf of the project owner/developer an Updated Will Serve Letter for an additional twelve months.

General Manager Fraser explained that one of the elements the District is including in this and future Will Serve Letters is that of securing the recycled water supply. As recycled water supply becomes available, the District wants to make sure that the water supply identified is allocated to the projects. Therefore, a component included as a condition of approval is to make sure that water supply identified in the plan of service, water supply assessments and our Urban Water Management Plan is allocated by the City of Beaumont to our district to be utilized in these type of projects. This condition of approval shifts the burden to the developer to secure entitlement to the recycled water supply for the project from the City of Beaumont.

After discussion, Director Slawson motioned to approve the Will Serve Letter. The motion was seconded by Director Covington and approved 4-0, with President Cottrell absent.

5. Consideration of Request for updated "Will Serve Letter" for Ongoing Development within K Hovnanian Homes – Four Seasons at Beaumont Development (Tract 33096-12).**(pages 42-63)

General Manager Fraser gave an overview of the request from K. Hovnanian ongoing development for an extension of the Will Serve Letter.

After discussion, Director Slawson motioned to approve the Will Serve Letter. The motion was seconded by Director Douglass, and passed 4-0 with President Cottrell absent.

6. Grand Avenue Storm Drain Project April 2016 Update**(pages 64-79)

General Manager Fraser gave a brief overview on the ongoing progress of the Grand Avenue Storm Drain Project. He stated the District continues to work with Riverside County Flood Control and Water Conservation District (RCFC&WCD) on the joint project. He stated partial funding has been secured by Proposition 84 grant and the estimated total project cost thus far is in the range of \$4,000,000 to \$5,000,000. He explained currently the three agencies are working on a Draft Project Charter (RCFC&WCD internal project document), as well as a Memorandum of Understanding. He hopes to have construction started in the next year or so and stated he hopes it will enhance the water supply 500 acre feet per year on average based on rainfall. He stated no action is required.

7. Reports For Discussion

a. Ad Hoc Committees

No reports were made.

b. General Manager

General Manager Fraser presented a PowerPoint presentation on the status of the water supply in the state, which continues to improve. He stated that the current water allocation of the State Water Project is at 45%. He shared that the current reservoirs condition according to the Department of Water Resources is as follows: Shasta Reservoir is at 91% full, which is 109% of the historical average for this date, Lake Oroville is at 91% full, which is at 116% of the historical average for this date. Lake Oroville started releasing water which ultimately flows under the Golden Gate Bridge to the Pacific Ocean in anticipation of a need for storm water capacity. Additionally, San Luis Reservoir is at 50% full, which is 56% of the historical average, which is a critical reservoir to get water to us, but without the tunnels project and the need to preserve fish habitat it's a challenge to get water to the south. He shared his frustration on the continued water conservation restrictions, when the State is releasing water under the Golden Gate Bridge. On a positive note, the District is delivering water into our recharge facility 24 hours a day.

c. Directors Reports

Director Slawson reported on attending the San Gorgonio Pass Regional Water Alliance. He gave a brief summary of the concerns, which included: how to get more water into our regions and the concerns of the California Water Fix.

Director Douglass reported on the previous BCVWD Joint Workshop between the different agencies who attended. He shared that the agency's representatives were going back to their individual Board members and discussing the Water Allocation Plan. He expressed that it was a good meeting.

Director Hoffman shared his observation of the water flowing into Phase I on the corner of Beaumont Ave. and Cherry Valley Blvd. and asked if the District knew how much water was being captured.

Director of Engineering, Dan Jaggers, explained that it's an average of 40-50 acre feet.

Improve the Efficiency and Effectiveness of the Organization.

Recommendation

It is recommended the Board consider authorizing the General Manager to send letters of support and other actions with respect to a legislative change in the governance structure of the San Gorgonio Pass Water Agency from seven to five members.

Background

The SGPWA is currently governed by a seven member board of directors, five by division and two at large. Other agencies with similar missions and larger size are typically governed by five member boards. The original size of the board allegedly mirrored the number of men who sought formation of the entity in the 1950's. On July 6, 2015, SGPWA's Board of Directors voted 6-0 to approve a resolution supporting a reduction in the board's size to five members and directed their General Manager to pursue legislation to accomplish this task. Since the agency was formed by an Act of the Legislature, it would require the Act to be amended to reduce the number of members.

Senator Morrell has introduced legislation, known as Senate Bill 1378, to amend the SGPWA Act that would facilitate this change (attached). Such a change would result in a reduction of costs to the SGPWA which is predominantly funded by the customers of the BCVWD through taxes and water sales revenue.

Financial Impact

The cost to ratepayers in the region could be reduced by several hundred thousand dollars once the revised governance structure is in place through the reduction in election, per-diem, and associated board member benefits.

Introduced by Senator Morrell

An act to amend Section 3 Sections 3 and 5 of the San Gorgonio Pass Water Agency Law (Chapter 1435 of the Statutes of 1961), relating to the San Gorgonio Pass Water Agency.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 1378, as amended, Morrell. San Gorgonio Pass Water Agency: board of directors.

Existing law, the San Gorgonio Pass Water Agency Law, establishes the San Gorgonio Pass Water Agency to, among other things, acquire, or contract to acquire, waterworks or a waterworks system, and other property useful or necessary to store, convey, supply, or otherwise make use of water, within a specified area of the County of Riverside. The law provides for a 7-member board of directors, 5 of whom are elected from 5 separate divisions, with 2 directors elected at large by the voters of the agency as a whole.

This bill would make a nonsubstantive change to the board of directors provision. decrease to 5 the number of members on the board of directors of the agency by removing the 2 directors elected at large.

SB 1378 -2-

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31 32 The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 3 of the San Gorgonio Pass Water Agency Law (Chapter 1435 of the Statutes of 1961), as amended by Section 2 of Chapter 41 of the Statutes of 1983, is amended to read:

Sec. 3. The board of directors shall, at its first meeting, or as soon thereafter as practicable, divide the agency-into shall be comprised of five divisions, which shall be as nearly as practicable equal in area. The divisions shall be numbered first, second, third, fourth, and fifth. One director shall be elected for each division by the voters thereof at the next general agency election following the organization of the agency, and two directors at large shall be elected at the election by the voters of the agency as a whole. agency. Each director elected or appointed for a division shall be an elector in that division, and each director at large shall be an elector in the agency. division. Each director elected or appointed for a division is herein called a "divisional director," and each of the two directors elected or appointed for the agency at large is herein called a "director at large." The two offices of directors at large shall respectively be known as "director at large No. 1" and "director at large No. 2." director.

SEC. 2. Section 5 of the San Gorgonio Pass Water Agency Law (Chapter 1435 of the Statutes of 1961), as amended by Section 1 of Chapter 249 of the Statutes of 1967, is amended to read:

Sec. 5. The board of directors of the agency organized under this act shall consist of—seven *five* members. The Board of Supervisors of Riverside County shall appoint the first board of directors, each of whom shall be a resident or owner of real property within the agency, and shall hold office until his *or her* successor is elected. Following the creation of the five divisions of the agency by the first board of directors, and at the first agency election thereafter, all successors of the first board shall be elected or chosen at the time and in the manner provided in the Uniform District Election Law, which shall apply to the agency.

Branch Extension Turnout.

Recommendation:

Consideration of authorizing the General Manager to provide a deposit of \$25,000 to the San Gorgonio Pass Water Agency (SGPWA) for any expenses incurred by the SGPWA for increasing the capacity of the District's existing East Branch Extension Turnout.

Background:

Over the past several years, the District has identified to the SGPWA that the District's raw water pipeline which connects the SGPWA East Branch Extension (EBX) turnout to the District's Noble Creek Recharge Facilities (NCRF) has a hydraulic capacity of at least 34 cubic feet per second or 67.32 acre feet per day and that the District would like to utilize the pipeline maximum capacity to convey water to the District's Noble Creek Recharge Facilities. The EBX turnout is located at the southwest side of Orchard Street where it intersects the Noble Creek Drainage Channel. The SGPWA's General Manager has indicated that the SGPWA EBX connection had a 20 cubic feet per second (39.6 acre feet per day) capacity.

The District also requested that the SGPWA provide a connection point on the existing Beaumont Avenue Recharge Facility (BARF) pipeline in order to provide for an opportunity to utilize the District's total NCRF recharge capacity which the District believes to be at least 25,000 acre feet per year and more likely 35,000 acre feet per year.

Once District Staff realized that the Department of Water Resources (DWR) allocation would be increased this year to an amount that could not be delivered by the SGPWA to the District over the course of the remaining year, District Staff identified that the upsizing of this connection could provide an opportunity to increase the delivery of State Project Water this year and ensure that no water would be lost due to lack of delivery when requested.

Based upon these facts the District subsequently prepared a letter (attached), dated March 10, 2016, making a formal request for the SGPWA to increase the capacity of the District's existing connection to the East Branch Extension from 20 cubic feet per second to 34 cubic feet per second and requested that the SGPWA provide a plan and time schedule along with a cost estimate for the upgrades to that existing connection that would be required to achieve said increase in flow rate. It is the District's position that the connection is existing and just requires modification to increase capacity (not a new connection). At the time the request was made, District Staff also reviewed the existing Noble Creek Recharge Facility Environmental Impact Report (EIR) and identified that there is no language in that document that limit the size of the existing connection or capacity of the Noble Creek Recharge Facility.

On March 24, 2016, the SGPWA's General Manager provided a response letter (attached) to the District's request identifying that before the SGPWA could begin processing the District's request, the District must complete an "Application for SGPWA Water Service in Accordance with SGPWA Ordinance No. 8" and submit certain items, including a down payment of \$25,000 for any expenses incurred by the Agency in processing the District's Application.

The basis for requiring an "Application for Water Service" in unclear, however, District Staff feels this project's timely forward movement is important to the District's water supply replenishment needs, especially after the prolonged drought experienced in California.

At this time, the District seeks Board Authorization to provide the required \$25,000 deposit (down payment) to the SGPWA in order to move this critical project forward.

Fiscal Impact:

The \$25,000 deposit should not have a significant fiscal impact to the District as these funds will be provided from existing Facilities Fees which have been collected from the development community to fund new (or in this case increased) facilities that are necessary to meet the needs of development.

Dear Mr. Davis:

This letter shall serve as a formal request to increase the capacity of the District's existing connection to the East Branch Extension at Orchard Street and Noble Creek from 20 cubic feet per second to 34 cubic feet per second.

The Beaumont-Cherry Valley Water District has reviewed the hydraulic capacity and associated velocities available within our existing transmission pipeline installed between the point of connection at the East Branch Extension at Orchard Street and Noble Creek and the associated metering station operated the Agency and the District's Noble Creek Recharge Facilities. The District has determined that said transmission pipeline has a hydraulic capacity of approximately 34 cubic feet per second (based upon head loss and maximum velocity criteria).

Please provide a plan and time schedule along with a cost estimate for the upgrades required to achieve a maximum flowrate of 34 cubic feet per second from the East Branch Extension at the District's Point of Connection.

Consideration should be given to using as much of the existing infrastructure that BCVWD's customers have already paid for as possible. Please feel free to contact me at (951) 845-9581, ext. 225 with any questions related to this project.

SUBJECT: Rehabilitation and repair of District Well No's 5, 13, 18 and RR1

Recommendation:

Staff recommends the Board of Directors authorize the General Manager to enter into a contract for the rehabilitation and repair of District Well No's 5, 13, 18 and RR1.

Background:

District staff has identified that many of Edgar Canyon's existing wells have not been serviced in the last 10-18 years. Therefore staff has selected four (4) wells to rehabilitate and repair (as necessary). These wells were selected for the following reasons: Wells 18 and RR1 pumping units have failed (i.e. loss of production), Well 5 has experienced a reduction in production capacity and Well 13 is a critical stand-by well that requires rehabilitation due to production issues and the extended period of time since the last maintenance cycle.

The rehabilitation and repair work of these wells is necessary to maintain maximum production capacity and efficiency in Edgar Canyon where an opportunity exists to recharge storm water in the Edgar Canyon watershed. This project provides for operational maintenance, maximizes well field redundancy, and provides an opportunity for the District to restore pumping capacity that may have diminished over time at each well. These wells provide production capacity that does not have to be replenished, as do the District's wells that are located in the Beaumont Basin. Maximizing the capacity of the Edgar Canyon wells helps to reduce the District's need for imported supplies.

Well 5 and RR1 are located in Lower Edgar Canyon and supply water to the 3040 (Noble) pressure zone. Water produced from Well 5 can also supply the 3620 (Upper Mesa) pressure zone through the emergency booster station at Well 4A.

Well 13 and 18 are located in Upper Edgar Canyon and pump to the Upper Edgar Reservoir which supplies the 3620 (Upper Mesa) pressure zone. Well 13 is classified as a stand-by source and operates as a back-up to Well 12 which is the primary source of water to the District's upper residence and a second, non-district residence located on Oak Glen Road approximately ½ mile north of the county line.

On March 31, 2016 Staff solicited bids for the rehabilitation and repair project related to these four (4) wells in the local newspaper (Record Gazette) and the District's website. The bid request also included an additive provision for chemical treatment which may be necessary and will be determined upon the findings of the initial well inspection video once the pumping equipment at each well is removed.



The District received bids from a total of three vendors. The bid results are as follows:

Each bid schedule includes additive bid items to cover additional work related to pump unit repair items which may be necessary to return each pumping unit to service.

Based on the bid results, staff recommends that the Board award the contract for the well rehabilitation project to Tri-County Pump Company in the amount of \$134,401.00 and authorize a proposed additive repair allowance contingency in the amount of \$11,250.00, subject to the approval of the General Manager for a total authorization in the amount of \$145,651.00.

Fiscal Impact:

The final cost of completed work is not anticipated to exceed \$145,651. Funds are available in the current fiscal year budgeted depreciation expense to be allocated to Capital Facilities Replacement.

Dear President Cottrell:

On behalf of the San Bernardino Valley Municipal Water District, I would like to formally invite your Board/Council to participate in a facilitated process to discuss regional water supply issues of mutual interest in the Pass area. Valley District's intent is to provide a forum that is conducive to developing lasting solutions.

Valley District made this offer informally at a Yucaipa Valley Water District Board of Directors Meeting on February 9. At that meeting, the offer appeared to be well received by those who were present at that meeting. Since that time, I understand that a number of interested agencies have appointed ad hoc committees to participate in the proposed facilitated process.

Again, the specific purpose of the proposed facilitated process is to bring all parties together to develop a common understanding of the water supply needs and how best to move in a positive, collaborative manner toward a solution that is acceptable to everyone. In order to maximize the effectiveness of the process, I would hope that all parties will participate.

The facilitated process will be conducted through a series of public workshop sessions including representatives of each agency that choose to participate. Members of the ad hoc committees would be responsible for reporting to and back from their respective Boards/Councils as progress is made.

The purpose of a facilitator for this process is to keep the group focused on the issues at hand, to allow each party to state their positions, to manage any conflict as it arises, and to assist in the development of preferred alternatives to reach resolution. While we have a facilitator in mind, we are not wedded to using him. If the group wishes to use a different facilitator, or wishes to proceed through a process to select one, Valley District will support that effort. We simply want each participating party to trust and feel comfortable with the facilitator chosen.

I understand there have been questions about how to pay for the services of the facilitator. While Valley District is willing to pay for the facilitator, we are flexible on this point. If you are more comfortable with having the group select and pay for the facilitator, that is acceptable to us. We

have offered to pay for the facilitator because we firmly believe that a collaborative process that produces lasting solutions is best for the region as a whole.

We will be scheduling an initial meeting in the near future where the facilitated process will be explained in detail. I trust that you will have someone from your elected body, preferably an ad hoc committee of two, present at that meeting. Then, assuming the group agrees to move forward, the next step will be to select a facilitator who will meet individually with each appointed ad hoc committee member to determine their desired outcomes. Once this part of the process is completed, a joint public meeting will be scheduled for the facilitator to initiate the resolution process.

My Board and I look forward to participating with you in this process over the next several months. Valley District staff will be in touch with you regarding a date for the initial meeting mentioned above.
