# 7. Authorization of General Manager to enter into a Contract for the Repair and Rehabilitation of Well 26

General Manager Jaggers reminded the Board that at the last meeting, he identified that Well 26 had been taken out of service due to a 20 to 30 percent decrease in flow. The well is co-owned with the City of Banning but is used primarily by BCVWD.

Bids were received on March 29 and are tallied in the staff report. The lowest responsive bidder was Legend Pump and Well for a total of \$61,018.80 on the base bid. Jaggers explained bid additive items, including chemical well rehabilitation and some ancillary items.

President Covington asked about specifics of the work; Mr. Jaggers responded. Covington noted that unless the Board authorizes the additive items with this vote, the well could be down another month if that additive work turns out to be needed.

Director Diaz asked if the District has worked before with Legend Pump and Well. Mr. Jaggers said yes, and they were found to be satisfactory. Director Diaz asked about the components of the bid. Director Hoffman asked about well horsepower. Mr. Jaggers noted it is 140 HP and is plumbed to the non-potable system. It produces about 1300 gpm in normal operation. Director Hoffman asked if Well 26 could be brought back into the potable water system if the Chromium 6 standard changes. Mr. Jaggers explained the District will continue to pump to the non-potable water system. He explained options to handle the Chromium 6 issue including blending.

Director Slawson clarified the package approval. Mr. Jaggers pointed out the additive items and noted that the staff would enjoy the flexibility for those options if that were the will of the Board. Discussion ensued regarding specific well repairs and bid additive items.

The Board authorized the General Manager to enter into a contract with Legend Pump and Well Service for an amount not to exceed \$142,900 for the Repair and Rehabilitation of Well 26.

#### 8. Reports For Discussion

a. Ad Hoc Committees:

Bogart Park Ad Hoc Committee: Director Hoffman reported that the committee met with representatives from Riverside County and the Beaumont-Cherry Valley Recreation and Parks District. Several components are in motion. Riverside County wants to give up the remaining six or seven years on the lease, as they are losing money due to maintenance.

The County would like to transfer the lease to BCVPRD and BCVWD would like to lease its portion to them in order to move forward and run the park. Legal aspects are being investigated.

Mr. Jaggers noted a discrepancy on the acreage figures listed and those in the GIS system. This needs to be resolved. The District also has some planned facilities for the park site, and wants to continue to have the opportunity to plan and service its facilities.

President Covington said there is great dialogue. At some point, the BCVWD will have to make sure the District's interests are served first. At one point, the park area was slated for recharge activities to help mitigate the nitrates in the Cherry Valley area. One of the goals is to enhance and preserve water quality.

Director Hoffman inquired about adding a Board agenda item to discuss the District's priorities regarding the site. President Covington requested a report to the Board at an Engineering Workshop regarding the vision that the District might have for those 80 acres and the park.

b. General Manager:

Mr. Jaggers reported that Director Hoffman was not the successful candidate for the LAFCO election. Jaggers added that the Metropolitan

Water District Board voted yesterday to fund both tunnels of the California Water Fix.

Jaggers reported that the 8<sup>th</sup> Street project was completed and the total cost was \$145,197. Director Hoffman reiterated the savings to the ratepayers. Director Ramirez suggested this could be posted to the District's website.

The Noble Creek facility was shut down for rehabilitation in March. Mr. Jaggers explained the work on the ponds. The flow has returned to Phase 1, and staff is filling Ponds 2A and 2B in time for the fishing derby. Capacity has been re-established.

Year-to-date in 2018, the District has taken delivery of 2,277 acre-feet of State Project Water and recharged 113 acre-feet for the City of Banning.

Motor rehab work has been done on wells 3 and 25. The wells 11, 12, 19 and 20 project is ongoing as approved earlier this year. Some modifications to pump bases were done at 12 and 19 to bring them up to Department of Water Resources (DWR) standards.

Jaggers advised that another white paper is being produced for presentation at next week's workshop in conjunction with the rate study and its effects on BCWVD.

President Covington asked about the status of the upgraded connection with the SGPWA. Mr. Jaggers reported that it is in the hands of the DWR. Jeff Davis, the GM of the SGPWA has reported that they were asked to send \$60,000 for plan check processing.

#### c. Directors' Reports:

Director Ramirez noted that he participated in the Association of California Water Agencies / Joint Powers Insurance Authority survey.

President Covington reported that the Personnel Committee met on March 26. The members received a presentation by HR Dynamics and Performance Management. The Committee had made a commitment to the Employees Association that the Personnel Policies and Procedures Manual would be updated and work is underway.

### SUBJECT: Consideration of Request for an Amendment of Will Serve Letters for the Sundance Specific Plan including TTMs 37426, 37427, and 37428 Pardee Homes Sundance – Specific Plan Amendment No. 3

### Staff Recommendation

Consider the request for each part of the three-part "Will Serve Letter" that serves as an amendment of the current "Will Serve Letter" for ongoing development within Pardee Homes–Sundance Master Planned Community (Tentative Tract Map 37428) and that serves as "Will Serve Letter(s)" for TTMs 37426 and 37427 per Pardee Homes - Sundance – Specific Plan Amendment No. 3:

- A. Approve the request for amendment of "Will Serve Letter" for Water Service
- B. Defer the request for amendment of "Will Serve Letter" for Water Service pending resolution of security agreement for supply of recycled water from the City of Beaumont, and securing a report of water supply conditions from the San Gorgonio Pass Water Agency
- C. Deny the request for amendment of "Will Serve Letter" for Water Service

### **Background**

Pardee Homes applied to the City of Beaumont for Amendment No. 3 to the Sundance Specific Plan and that application was approved by the City of Beaumont City Council on May 2, 2018. That Amendment included revision to two Planning Areas (PA 13 and PA 47) and the addition of one new Planning Area (PA 54). Revision to each planning area and impacts to said planning areas are generally identified as follows:

A more complete description of each planning area component is further described in the following sections related to each planning area.



Pardee Homes originally presented their request to revise the existing Planning Areas PA 13 (Tentative Tract Map 37426) and PA 47 (Tentative Tract Map 37428) and add PA 54 (Tentative Tract Map 37427) to the District in their February 12, 2016 letter entitled "Sundance - Specific Plan Amendment No. 3 Will Serve Letter Requests for Tentative Tract Maps 37426, 37427, and 37428".

In that letter, Pardee Homes presented their preliminary reasons as to why they should be considered for approval of the requested "Will Serve Letter" amendments. District Staff has subsequently met with Pardee Homes and attempted to clarify their request for amendment to better understand the demands needed for the proposed amendments and their impacts to the District's planned water supply for the Sundance Specific Plan. District Staff also responded in writing to Pardee Homes on April 18, 2018. Additional clarification to the original letter as well as Pardee Homes has been presented by Pardee Homes in their May 2, 2018 email, attached.

District Staff understands that Pardee Homes is requesting a three-part request for water service for developments which consists of the modification of use for two existing planning areas located within the existing Sundance Specific Plan as well as the addition of one new Planning Area to the Specific Plan. District Staff has further identified the current status and requested modification of each of the Planning Areas as follows:

## 1. PA 47 Currently Identified as Tract 31469-5 (Proposed Tentative Tract Map 37428)

- Existing Tract 31469 WSL clearly identified a total number of 97 Dwelling Units 97 for this Planning Area per Tentative Tract Map 31469 attached as part of the WSL, Last Updated Oct. 2017
- b. Proposed re-development which will require an amended WSL includes re-lot of said Tract 31469-5 from 97 to 138 dwelling units (EDUs (additional 41 EDUs)
- c. Minimum Lot sizes will decrease from 10,000 sf to 7,500 sf
- d. BCVWD has previously plan checked and approved Water Facilities Plans consistent with development of 97 dwelling units
- e. Water Main Extension and Facilities Agreement has been executed by BCVWD and Pardee Homes for 97 dwelling units and facilities fees paid by Pardee Homes for 97 dwelling units

# 2. Planning Area 13 (Currently identified as Tentative Tract Map 37426):

- a. Proposed Development replaces Specific Plan identified Junior High School site located at the south end of the Sundance Specific Plan with 90 dwelling units
- b. No active "Will Serve Letter" (original "Will Serve Letter" was issued for this area as part of the original Sundance Specific Plan)

# 3. Proposed Planning Area 54 (TTM 37427)

 Proposed addition of new Planning Area 54 consisting of re-development of existing Beaumont Unified School District's Chavez School site to provide for 31 new dwelling units



- b. No "Will Serve Letter" was issued for this area as part of the original Sundance Specific Plan. This area was not included within the original Sundance Specific Plan
- c. Replace existing (but currently closed) school site with 31 proposed dwelling units
- d. Historically consuming water as a school use since at least the early 1990s.

As part of these three "Will Serve Letter" requests, Pardee posits that additions of Equivalent Dwelling Units (EDUs) will reduce the estimated water use by the project. The District is unconvinced that the requested development will actually reduce water system demands as further discussed hereafter.

BCVWD identifies that the total EDUs has decreased from the original Specific Plan Approval number of 4,716, through Specific Plan Amendments No. 1 and No. 2, to 4,450 EDUs per Specific Plan Amendment 2.

While the District has continuously supported the approved Sundance Specific plan and has issued the current "Will Serve Letter" with specific EDUs assigned to Tracts 31469 and 31470, the requested increase of 159 EDUs per Specific Plan Amendment 3 creates further water supply demands on the District's water system.

While District Staff understands that the original Plan of Service prepared by the District was based on an original development of approximately 4,700 dwelling Units, the water supply environment has changed since the 2002 Specific Plan was approved by the District. The assumptions of water supply set forth in BCVWD's Plan of Service for this project for Pardee Construction, dated March 4, 2002 identify certain sources of supply that do not represent the actual current supplies and therefore require review and adjustment as the District reviews Pardee Homes application for the requested amended and new Will Serve Letters.

Three items that have significantly changed and require adjustment since the preparation of the original plan includes the following:

**Basin Safe Yield** in the 2002 Plan of Service was identified at 8,650 acre feet per year. Now the revised Basin Safe Yield (as of 2013) is 6,700-acre feet per year. This results in a reduction of 1,950 acre feet of available water supply to be re-allocated to the Appropriators named in the Beaumont Basin adjudication. (BCVWD receives approximately 43% of the unused overlier reallocation.) This redetermination results in a reduction in BCVWD's share of overlier reallocation opportunity of approximately 835-acre feet per year just due to the reduction in safe yield.

**Recycled Water Availability** in the 2002 Plan of Service was identified at being approximately 1 million gallons per day (1,120-acre feet per year) with an ultimate available recycled water source of 4 million gallons per day (4,480-acre feet per year. Since the City of Beaumont has never produced Title 22 recycled water, this water supply has not yet been realized. This equates to a loss of supply that would have provided an increase to water in storage that would have added an opportunity to move these projects forward.



**State Water Project Reliability Factor** in the 2002 Plan of Service was identified as being 75% reliable. The current State Water Project (SWP) reliability is 60% with a possibility to degrade to as low as 42% to 48% in the event the California Water Fix is not completed. These factors change the available SWP supply to the region (based on the SGPWA's Table "A" entitlement of 17,300 AFY) to 10,380 AFY at 60% reliable to as low as 7,266 AFY at 42% reliable. This fact results in a total reduction in planned supply considered by the original Plan of Service as follows:

In these various supply scenarios, the region will experience a supply reduction of 2,595 AFY minimum to 5,709 AFY maximum from the amount anticipated by BCVWD in 2002. BCVWD is working with the SGPWA to seek out other imported supply opportunities. Participating in larger projects like the California Water Fix and Sites Reservoir could enable the SGPWA to recover the lost reliability in their SWP water supply. However, these larger projects are still preliminary and are not yet certain sources of supply.

Given the ongoing challenges of procuring additional water supply for the Beaumont Basin, and the increasing costs of imported water, BCWVD Staff identifies that estimated water needs of the proposed project, even if reduced by the amounts proposed by Pardee Homes, does not necessarily accurately address ongoing revised water supply needs and availability. At this time, District Staff needs to continue work with the City of Beaumont to gain understanding related to if and when recycled water supply will be made available, and further understand the San Gorgonio Pass Water Agency's long-term water supply portfolio projections and anticipated supplies. District Staff has been working diligently on all of these fronts and hopes that these items will resolve into final solutions and understandings in the next few months.

As stated previously, Pardee originally presented their original request in a February 12, 2016 letter entitled "Sundance - Specific Plan Amendment No. 3 Will Serve Letter Requests for Tentative Tract Maps 37426, 37427, and 37428." That letter included water use calculations prepared by the Pardee engineering consultant, which presented their assessment that that increased density of homes would create a reduction in actual water demand within the development. Specifically, as exterior / landscape water use is usually greater than interior fixture use. The analysis presented that smaller lots would use less water.

District Staff identified that it appears that the calculations presented by Pardee in their February 12, 2018 letter and calculations may be overly optimistic based on their methodology, since the factors used from information obtained from Eastern Municipal Water District (EMWD) and Coachella Valley Water District (CVWD), which have been mingled together can present a skewed estimate of GPCD.



Pardee's consultant Michael Baker appears to have used the Gallons per Capita Per Day (GPCD) figures of EMWD, a nearby water district in a similar type of climate region as BCVWD, then reduced those figures by 18 percent, based on calculations presented in Coachella Valley Water District's (CVWD) 2015 UWMP, produced at the height of the drought and mandatory conservation in a desert region with greater landscaping restrictions. District Staff identified that the calculated water savings appeared optimistic that an 18 percent reduction in water use would be the ongoing normal, even given more stringent landscaping restrictions and water-saving interior fixtures.

Based upon these facts, District Staff requested that Pardee Homes revisit the calculations and offer additional support to provide for a more complete analysis of possible water supplies savings.

As part of the District's April 18, 2018 letter, Staff identified concerns related to specific items regarding each of the requested Specific Plan Amendment No. 3:

- **PA 47 Currently Identified as Tract 31469-5** (Proposed Tentative Tract Map 37428) adds 41 EDUs to the previously approved and supported existing "Will Serve Letter".
- Planning Area 13 (Currently identified as Tentative Tract Map 37426 the proposed development replaces Specific Plan identified Junior High School site located at the south end of the Sundance Specific Plan with 90 dwelling units. In the District's view, this request is a new water supply demand as the letter from Beaumont Unified School District provided by Pardee Homes as part of the February 12, 2018 request only states that the BUSD is not able to use the Site located a Planning Area 13 as the proximity of this location is too close to existing school sites. In the event this school is relocated within the District's service area, the school would still add a demand to the District water supply that is the result of the development of the Sundance Specific Plan (and the added load provided by the additional requested EDU's from all 3 requests). Pardee Homes has indicated in email discussions that BUSD is looking at development in Banning as a potential replacement school site, however, there are not yet any supporting written documents from BUSD that support this relocation.
- **Proposed Planning Area 54 (TTM 37427)** The proposed development suggests that the trade of water use from the existing school site should be available for the development of this site. District Staff identified to Pardee that students, school facilities, and operations originally located at the Chavez School Site have been absorbed into various Specific Plan provided schools (including the Sundance Specific Plan) as part of the original overall planning, and the old Chavez School site EDUs were traded for the development of the Specific Plans for the new developments with the associated school planning. Based on this fact, District Staff identified that the existing school site EDU usage is not an existing demand are therefore are not available for use in new re-development of this property.

Pardee homes subsequently provided further analysis related to water savings that have occurred in the northern half of the Sundance Specific Plan. Subsequent to BCVWD approval of "Will Serve Letters" for Tract 31469 and 31470, in their May 2, 2018 email regarding this matter Pardee Homes provided reasons why they feel that changes that have been made, together with the previously stated reasons, will provide an overall reduction of water supply needs for the Sundance Specific Plan even with the requested additional EDUs requested.



At this point, Pardee Homes has presented a number of points of analysis that generally support that the added homes could reduce the overall project demand to less than was originally presented during the "Will Serve Letter" updates provided over the years, specifically for Tracts 31469 and 31470.

Pardee Homes has requested to have this issue presented to the Board for consideration of their request for a "Will Serve Letter" that addresses each of the three Planning Areas. Pardee Homes has requested the Board consider the amendment of the current "Will Serve Letter" to include ongoing development within Tract 31469 (Planning Area 47), revise Planning Area 13 (SP Junior High School Site to cluster product), and add Planning Area 54 (Chavez School Site to 31 dwelling units).

## Fiscal Impact

None. All fees and deposits will be paid by the Applicant prior to providing service.

As part of these three "Will Serve Letter" requests, Pardee posits that additions of Equivalent Dwelling Units (EDUs) will reduce the estimated water use by the project. The District is unconvinced that this will actually be the fact as further discussed hereafter.

BCVWD also identifies that the total EDUs has decreased from the original Specific Plan Approval number of 4,700. Regardless, BCVWD Staff understands that the history of this particular development is as follows:

# <u>History</u>

The original Deutsch Specific Plan was approved in 1991 with 4,716 Dwelling Units.

The first amendment for the Sundance Specific Plan (SP) was approved in 2004 and was further amended in 2006.

The current 2018 amendment proposes the addition of 162 Dwelling Units above the approved first two amendments.

While the District has continuously supported the approved Sundance Specific plan and has issued the current "Will Serve Letter" with specific EDU's assigned to Tract 31469 and 31470 the requested increase of 162 EDUs per Specific Plan Amendment 3 creates further water supply demands on the District's water system.

While District Staff understands that the original Plan of Service prepared by the District was based on an original development of approximately 4,700 dwelling Units, the water supply environment has changed since the 2002 Specific Plan was approved by the District and in fact the assumptions of water supply set forth in BCVWD's Plan of Service for this project for Pardee Construction, dated March 4,

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2002 identify certain sources of supply that require adjustment as the District reviews Pardee Homes application for the requested amended and new will serve letters.

Two items that have significantly changed and require adjustment since the preparation of the original plan includes the following:

**Basin Safe Yield** in the 2002 Plan of Service was identified at 8,650 acre feet per year. Now the revised Basin Safe Yield (as of 2013) is 6,700 acre feet per year. This results in a reduction of 1,950 acre feet of available water supply to be re-allocated to the Appropriators named in the adjudication (BCVWD receives approximately 43% of the unused overlyer reallocation). This redetermination results in a reduction in BCVWD's share of overlier reallocation opportunity of approximately 835 acre feet per year just due to the reduction in safe yield.

**Recycled Water Availability** in the 2002 Plan of Service was identified at being approximately 1 million gallons per day (1,120 acre feet per year) with an ultimate available recycled water source of 4 million gallons per day (4,480 acre feet per year. Since the City has never produced Title 22 recycled water, this water supply has not been realized yet. This equates to a loss of supply that would have provided an increase to water in storage that would have added an opportunity to move these projects forward.

Given the ongoing challenges of procuring additional water supply for the Beaumont Basin, and the increasing costs of imported water, BCWVD finds it necessary to further examine the estimated water needs of the proposed project, work with the City of Beaumont to gain understanding related to if and when recycled water supply will be made available, and further understand the San Gorgonio Pass Water Agency's long term water supply portfolio projections and anticipated supplies. District Staff has been working diligently on all of these fronts and hopes that these items will resolve into final solutions and understandings in the next few months.

Regarding water use calculations prepared by Pardee Homes engineering consultant District Staff clarifies that while it is possible that increased density of homes could create a reduction in water demand, as exterior / landscape water use is usually greater than interior fixture use. Smaller lots might use less water.

Based upon these facts, District Staff identifies that the presented information should be revisited to provide for a more complete analysis. Further Staff anticipates that the actual water demand (GPCD) may be closer to the actual figures observed by EMWD, however, Staff further identifies that the current casting of future demand numbers is affected by the recent 2014/2015 drought in California. More reasonable numbers for future water demand projections will most likely be available in the District's upcoming 2020 Urban Water Management Plan preparation.

In addition to the general facts set forth above, District Staff also identify the following specific items regarding each of the requested "Will Serve Letters" or amendments thereto should be specifically addressed and or clarified prior to moving the request forward to the Board for consideration:

- **PA 47 Currently Identified as Tract 31469-5** (Proposed Tentative Tract Map 37428) adds 41 EDUs to the previously approved and supported existing "Will Serve Letter". The water consumption calculations should be revisited as identified above prior to finalizing request for amended "Will Serve Letter".
- Planning Area 13 (Currently identified as Tentative Tract Map 37426 the proposed development replaces Specific Plan identified Junior High School site located at the south end of the Sundance Specific Plan with 90 dwelling units. In the District's view, this request is a new water supply demand as the thee letter from Beaumont Unified School District provided by Pardee Homes as part of the request only states that the BUSD is not able to use the Site located a Planning Area 13 as the proximity of this location is too close to existing school sites. Dan and Kaden, we have been researching our justification for the Will Serve Letter's associated with Planning Area 47 (Proposed TTM 37428), Planning Area 13 (Currently TTM 37426), and Planning Area 54 (Currently TTM 37427). The below analyses help support our request, as we believe we are creating water savings in several different ways. These are as follows:

>

There is significant water savings as a result of converting 704 du convention homes to our Altis 704 du active adult community. The basis for our assumptions are that the active adult homes will be sold to one or two retirees with no kids living in the home, so the homes will have less than two occupants on average. If the average house uses 580 gallons of water per day, and 50% of this consumption is for outside uses, that would project inside water use at 290 gallons per day, and for four people, 72.5 gallons per day per person. Although there are new landscaping laws for all new houses being built within Sundance, the overall projected water consumption figures are based on figures we picked up from various sources. If less water is utilized for landscaping and outdoor uses, these figures would decrease, although there is still a significant savings in water between conventional housing and active adult housing.

Active adult homes cover approximately 20% more of the lot than conventional 2-story homes, because all the homes are single story, although two models have 2nd story options. All living spaces are on the ground floor. 20% less water for outside uses is 58 gallons per day (20% of 290 gpd) less water use, or 21,170 gallons per house per year. For 704 homes, this is 14,903,680 gallons of savings. With less outside area available in active adult homes, we also believe there will be more patios and less landscaping, with landscaping being centered around planters and pots, which are also easier to maintain. We have assumed two people in a house use approximately 50% less than four people, so the inside water use for two people is 145 gallons per day versus 290 for four people. Total active adult inside water use is about 52,925 gallons per year. For 704 homes, this is a savings of 37,259,200 gallons per year. We believe that active adult residents will use less water per day than standard housing residents, even though they may spend more time in their homes on average. However, many retirees like to travel to visit kids and family more frequently, as well as take many more and longer vacations. These activities more than balance out our theory that overall water usage is less in the active community.

Outside savings is projected to be as much as 14,903,680 gallons per year and indoor savings an additional 37,259,200 gallons per year, a total projected savings of 52,162,880 gallons per year, or 156 ac-ft/yr. The active adult community has a large recreation center building with a trail system throughout the community. This will use additional water. We have calculated water usage at approximately 40 ac-ft/yr, dropping the net savings from the active adult community to 116 ac-ft/yr. This amounts to roughly 300 homes of added capacity within the overall Sundance Community.

Our request is for an additional 159 homes. 84 homes are clusters with very little outdoor landscaping, thus much less water use than 580 gallons per day. By having smaller lots in PA 47, we believe the increase of 41 additional lots is almost offset with water savings by reducing 11,250 sf lots down to 8,000 sf lots with similar sized homes. All the 3,250 sf of additional lot area would be irrigated savings. Some of these lots will be larger than 8,000 sf, although the lot average will drop significantly with our increased number of lots.

In the letter dated February 12, 2018 to you, we provided projections provided by our engineer Michael Baker showing water savings for the two school sites. We believe the school sites conversion to homes provides an overall water savings on PA 13 of 48.6 ac-ft/yr and PA 54 a reduction of 8.3 ac-ft/yr on top of this active adult analysis. PA 47 increase was reflected in this letter as showing a 7.1 ac-ft/yr reduction, although we now believe this is effectively a push.

The total water savings between Acitve Adult savings of 116 ac-ft/yr; PA 13 is 48.6 ac-ft/yr; and PA 54 (Chavez) is 8.3 ac-ft/yr. Combined, total water savings throughout Sundance is approximately 173 ac-ft/yr, or roughly enough water to service 345 additional homes. Our request is for 159 homes.

Two last important issues to note are as follows:

- There is reference to Planning Area 48 in the Sundance Product Distribution Map, reflecting 112, 10,000 sf lots. Pardee has recently plotted 10,000 sf lots on this parcel as a stand-alone development, and the maximum number of lots Pardee could lay out was 76 lots, not 110 lots. PA 48 is not owned by Pardee Homes, is located in the County of Riverside, and is not annexed into BCVWD nor the City of Beaumont. If it were to be developed, it would face stiff opposition from the Cherry Valley HOA group. Pardee Homes made a commitment at the City Council meeting May 1, 2018 that it would not acquire, nor develop PA 48. We believe the likelihood of this PA moving forward to a development is very remote.
- 2. Beaumont Unified School District vacated plans for a junior high school site on PA 13, which was 22 acres. PA 13 is now 11 acres, with the balance of 11 acres going to open space area and increasing the detention basin for PA 14 by 11 acres. BUSD has notified Pardee that any future junior high school site in this area would almost certainly be located in Pardee's City of Banning project, east of Highland Springs Avenue. Pardee has plans for two school sites on this Banning development site, and has been working closely with BUSD for many years.

We are hopeful this analysis helps to offset some of the concerns for additional water needed for the 159 additional homes. The Sundance Specific Plan is entitled for 4,450 homes. With the recent approvals for PA 13, 47 and 54, the maximum number of units to be developed is 4,411. If PA 48 is deducted from this total, the maximum number of homes Pardee will develop will be 4,299 du's.

Dear Mr. Jaggers,

As you are aware, Pardee Homes (Pardee) is actively constructing infrastructure and homes in our Sundance Specific Plan (SP) located within the City of Beaumont (City). The SP was originally analyzed to consist of 4,700 equivalent dwelling units (EDUs) in Beaumont Cherry Valley Water District's (BCVWD) Plan of Service dated March 4, 2002 (POS 2002, see Attachment A). Over the years, Pardee has reduced its entitlement from 4,700 EDUs to 4,450 EDUs with a current plan to only build 4,140 EDUs. Both backbone and in-tract infrastructure have been adequately sized and continuously constructed to accommodate the SP's 4,450 EDUs.

Pardee is currently processing SP Amendment No. 3 (SPA#3) along with three (3) new tentative tract maps (TTM) with the City that will accomplish several items such as:

- Planning Area (PA) 13: Propose to lot the future junior high school site into 90 EDUs.
- PA 47: Re-lot from 97 EDUs to 138 DUs.
- PA 54: Lot the existing Chavez Elementary School into 31 EDUs.

SPA#3 will increase the total EDUs to 4,140 to 4,302.

#### PA 13 (TTM 37426)

PA 13 was originally located within TTM 31468 and planned to be a future junior high school site (School). The School was to encompass approximately 23-acres consisting of a 12-acre School and 11-acres being irrigated play fields, etc. Pardee was informed during various meetings with the Beaumont Unified School District (BUSD) that they were no longer interested in using this site for a School. The BUSD letter to that effect is included as Attachment B.

Per SPA#3, Pardee plans to develop PA 13 into 90 EDUs on approximately 12-acres and 11acres as natural open space. PA 13 does not have an active Will Serve letter. However, it should be noted that PA 13 was analyzed in the SP's environmental impact report (EIR).

#### PA 47 (TTM 37428)

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PA 47 is currently located within TTM 31469, consists of 97 EDUs and has an active Will Serve letter. Improvement plans have been approved for the 97 EDUs and facility fees paid as well. The BCVWD originally issued a Will Serve letter for TTM 31469 on 9/9/14 with subsequent extensions issued yearly since (see Attachment C).

Per SPA#3, Pardee plans to re-lot PA 47 from 97 EDUs into 138 EDUs. Lot sizes will decrease from approximately 10,000-sf to 7,500-sf. The current Will Serve letter does not include the additional 41 EDUs however the area was included in the BCVWD 2002 POS for the SP.

#### PA 54 (TTM 37427)

PA 54 is the existing Chavez Elementary School (Chavez) located north of Cougar Way and east of Cherry Avenue. Chavez is not currently being used by the BUSD as a functioning school but more as a storage yard. Pardee has an agreement to purchase Chavez from the BUSD pending City approval of SPA#3.

Per SPA#3, Pardee plans to develop PA 54 into 31 EDUs. PA 54 does not have a current Will Serve letter and was not included in the BCVWD 2002 POS for the SP but has historically been consuming water.

#### Water Analysis

Michael Baker International completed a Water Use Evaluation comparing the existing water demands with the proposed water demands for the aforementioned PAs and issued a Technical Memorandum (Tech Memo) of the results (see Attachment D). The Tech Memo compiled published water usage and reduction factors from Eastern Municipal Water District (EMWD) and Coachella Valley Water District (CVWD), respectively. Results are summarized below:

- PA 13: Proposed build out of 90 EDUs will result in a <u>reduction</u> in water usage of 48.6 ac-ft/yr when compared to a being built as a School.
- PA 47: Proposed build out of 138 EDUs will result in a <u>reduction</u> in water usage of 7.1 ac-ft/yr when compared to current lotting of 97 EDUs.
- PA 54: Proposed build out of 31 EDUs will result in a <u>reduction</u> in water usage of 8.3 ac-ft/yr when compared to current Chavez site as an operating school site.

#### **Conclusion**

Combining the proposed lotting with the existing approvals, the current Sundance SP build out will consist of 4,302 EDUs. These totals exclude PA 48 which is not under the ownership of Pardee (see Attachment E). In addition to the overall reduction of 398 EDUs (4,700 - 4,302) in our SP, the following land usages have been reduced when compared to the BCVWD 2002 POS:

- Commercial: Current plan = 13.6-acres; 2002 POS = 50-acres; <u>Reduction</u> of 36.4-acres
- Schools: Current plan = 40.4-acres; 2002 POS = 75-acres; <u>Reduction</u> of 34.6-acres.

The current, overall reduction of the SP's total number of EDUs, commercial and school acreages from the SP's original entitlement and 2002 POS is substantial and thus would equate to a substantial reduction in overall water usage.

We respectfully request a Will Serve letter from the BCVWD for TTMs 37426, 37427 and 37428.

#### Introduction

Pardee Construction is considering developing the property formally known as the Deutsch property. Pardee Construction is requesting annexation to the Beaumont-Cherry Valley Water District (District) for their project. The Project will consist of approximately 4,700 single-family residential dwelling units, approximately 50 acres of commercial development, 75 acres for schools, and approximately 60 acres of parks. The general location of the Project is in Section 35, T2S, R1W SBB&M and Section 2, T3S, R1W SBB&M within the city limits of Beaumont. The Project is bounded by Highland Springs Avenue on the east, Brookside Avenue on the north, Cherry Avenue on the west, and 8th Street on the south. The annexation area consists of approximately 1,140 acres of currently undeveloped dry farming land. The Project will be served from three pressure zones. The District's 3040 (Noble) Pressure Zone will generally serve the area in the north half of Section 35. The 2850 (Intermediate) Pressure Zone will serve the south half of Section 35 and generally the north three quarters of Section 2, and the 2750 (Beaumont) Pressure Zone will serve the south one quarter of Section 2. The initial phase of the Project is identified as Tentative Tract No. 30332. The general location for the initial phase of the Project is in the northeast quarter and in the north half of the southeast quarter of Section 2, T3S, R1W SBB&M. The initial phase of the Project is bounded by Highland Springs Avenue on the east and the existing Southern California Edison easement on the north. The initial phase of the project will consist of 870 single family detached homes and a 14.5 acre site for commercial development on approximately 363 acres. Tract No. 30332 will be served from the District's 2850 (Intermediate Zone). This Plan of Services utilizes information from the District's 1994 Water System Master Plan Update, which addresses water demands and master planned facilities for the project. This master plan is currently being updated. Land use information was obtained from the city of Beaumont Planning Department's General Plan and is zoned for single family and commercial. The site currently consists of agricultural land and open space traversed by several natural runoff gullies. The tentative schedule for the Project has a start date of approximately 2002.

#### **Overall Project Water System Improvements**

The Project will be served from the District's 3040 (Noble), 2850 (Intermediate), and 2750 (Beaumont) Pressure Zones. The District currently has no existing facilities to support the development of the Project. The required backbone facilities to serve potable and recycled water to the overall Project include the following and are shown in Exhibit "A":

- 5. Approximately 2,450 LF 24" south from Brookside Avenue to a point representing the future extension of Sixteenth Street.
- 6. Approximately 1,215 LF 18" from a point representing the future extension of Sixteenth Street south 1,215 feet.
- 7. Approximately 2,315 LF 16" from the termination of the 18" to the future extension of Fourteenth Street.
- 8. Approximately 8,205 LF 12" in the tract loop street from the future Fourteenth Street south in the loop street to the middle of the tract. North in-tract street around the proposed park north to Fourteenth Street.
- 9. Approximately 2,580 LF 12" in the future extension of 16<sup>th</sup> Street from Cherry Avenue to a point on the future 24"/18" water main.
- 10. Approximately 2,540 LF 12" from a connection point to the 18"/16" water main east to Highland Springs Avenue.
- 11. Approximately 2,885 LF 12" in Highland Springs Avenue from the future 12" water main (Item No. 9) to the future extension of 14<sup>th</sup> Street.
- 12. Approximately 5,150 LF 12" in Cherry Avenue from 16<sup>th</sup> Street to a point 2,500 feet south of 14<sup>th</sup> Street.

Three wells with a capacity of approximately 2,100 gpm each.

- 3. Approximately 2,050 LF 24" in 12th Street from the 12<sup>th</sup> and Palm Booster Station to Cherry Avenue.
- 4. Approximately 915 LF 12" in Highland Springs Avenue from 8th Street north 915 feet.

#### Storage Tank

One 2.5 million-gallon storage reservoir at the Cherry Tank site.

#### <u>Wells</u>

Two wells with a capacity of approximately 2,000 gpm each.

### Recycled Water System Improvements

#### **Pipelines**

- 1. Approximately 5,280 LF 24" in Cherry Avenue from a future storage tank at the intersection of Cherry and Brookside Avenues to 14<sup>th</sup> Street.
- 2. Approximately 5,455 LF 12" in future 14th Street from Cherry Avenue to Highland Springs Avenue.
- 3. Approximately 4,500 LF 8" in Cherry Avenue from 14<sup>th</sup> Street to future wetlands incidental recharge basins.

#### Storage Tank

One 2 million-gallon storage reservoir at the southeast intersection of Cherry and Brookside Avenues.

# Initial Phase (Tract No. 30332) Water System Improvements

The initial phase, Tract No. 30332 of the project will be served from the District's 2850 (Intermediate) Pressure Zone. The required backbone facilities to serve potable and recycled water to the initial phase of the Project include the following:

- 4. Approximately 8,205 LF 12" in the tract loop street from the future Fourteenth Street south in the loop street to the middle of the tract. North in-tract street around the proposed park north to Fourteenth Street.

#### <u>Wells</u>

One well site located north of future Fourteenth Street in area of a future park.

#### Recycled Water System Improvements

- 1. Approximately 5,455 LF 12" in future 14th Street from Cherry Avenue to Highland Springs Avenue.
- 2. Approximately 1,400 LF 6" (estimated) is to be required from future Fourteenth Street to the proposed park. Final sizing of the line will be determined based on the park water demand.

#### District Background

Beaumont-Cherry Valley Water District (District) was first formed in April 1919, to provide irrigation water to the new community of Beaumont and the surrounding area. The District was originally named the Beaumont Irrigation District. In 1973 the name was changed to the Beaumont-Cherry Valley Water District. However, even though the name has changed, the District's authority comes from the Irrigation District Law of the State of California.

The District's present service area covers about 7 square miles, virtually all of which is in Riverside County. The District's ultimate service planning area encompasses an area of about 40 square miles. (See Exhibit "B" attached)

#### Water Supply

The District presently extracts water from two groundwater sources to meet the District's water demand, Edgar Canyon and the Beaumont Basin. The table below shows the total amount of water extracted over the previous five years from the two sources.

The Beaumont Basin is a very large groundwater source reportedly containing as much as 1.1 million acre-feet of groundwater in storage. This volume of water can be used to over come short term reductions in the amount of imported water supply, if necessary. Based on District studies and studies prepared by San Gorgonio Pass Water Agency (Pass Water Agency) and the San Timoteo Watershed Management Authority, it is estimated that the long-term safe yield for the Edgar Canyon is 2,600 ac-ft/yr and Beaumont Basins is about 8,600 ac-ft/yr. These volumes should only be considered as estimates. The San Timoteo Watershed Management Authority was formed in early 2001 to manage the surface and groundwater as well as import and recycled water.

As development increases, the need for additional potable water sources will increase. The District is actively pursuing additional water sources to meet the future demands within the District's service area. Recently passed legislation (Senate Bill No. 221, "Kuehl Bill") stipulates that legislative bodies of a city, county, or public water system provide written verification that a sufficient water supply is available prior to completion of a project/subdivision. A subdivision is defined in the Kuehl Bill as "a proposed residential development of more than 500 dwelling units for a public water system with 5,000 services connections or more" which is applicable to BCVWD. To augment existing water sources, which is presently totally groundwater extractions, BCVWD is developing a project that will capture stormwater flows in Little San Gorgonio and Noble Creeks and deliver the stormwater flows, through a pipeline, to percolation basins for recharge to groundwater basins. The project consists of debris basins, pipelines, and percolation ponds. The project will also be able to receive State Project Water from San Gorgonio Pass Water Agency for groundwater recharge. The estimated yearly average long-term capture of stormwater flows is 4,100 acre-ft/yr. The District has secured funding for the required environmental studies and report and 30% design of the project. Presently the conceptual design is complete and the environmental effort is on going. The District is also completing a pilot test program to determine the percolation rates at the location of the percolation ponds.

Current irrigation water demand within the District's Sphere Of Influence is estimated to be approximately 4,000 ac.ft. annually including three championship golf courses 2 executive length courses and numerous green belt areas like schools and parks. The City of Beaumont estimates that the average annual wastewater collected per EDU is .32 ac ft. The District and the city of Beaumont are working together to implement a water recycling system. The use of

recycled water for the parks, golf courses, and other open areas will "free-up" available potable water, which is presently being used for irrigation. It is estimated that presently about 1 million gallons per day (1,120 ac-ft/yr) would be available from the City's wastewater treatment plant for recycled use with an ultimate available recycled water source of 4 million gallons per day (4,480 ac-ft/yr). The District is presently installing a water recycle distribution system as new development occurs. The District also collects a Facility Fee from each new EDU. This fee will provide capital for the District and the City to complete the recycled water system as development occurs.

The storm capture project discussed above will provide the district with enough new source water to supply 6,700 EDU. The recycled water from those EDU will provide more than 2,100 ac.ft. of recycled irrigation water to supply existing golf course and green belt water demand that is currently being satisfied by potable water. The potable water saved by conversation to recycled water will provide new source water for an additional 3,500 EDU.

The City of Beaumont is also working with the development community to develop three "Incidental Recharge" areas. These locations are being constructed to capture urban storm runoff for recharge to the groundwater basin. One such area exits on the Pardee Project along the southwest corner of the project. The City has projected that this project will capture and recharge 500 ac ft of storm water that may also be used to blend with surplus recycled water.

Additional sources of water for future development include State Project Water imported through the Pass Water Agency. The Pass Water Agency has presently indicated that the District's pro-rata share of the Pass Water Agency's 17,300 acre-ft/yr entitlement of imported water is estimated to be 8,650 acre-feet per year. The Pass Water Agency has established no formal allocation policy. The pro-rata share of 8,650 acre-feet per year is based on assessed valuation. This figure can only be considered preliminary.

#### Water Demand

The District currently serves approximately 147 agriculture users, 263 commercial users, 7 industrial users, and 5755 domestic residential and irrigation users. The following table shows the approximate amount of water used by each user classification in 2001.

The average daily domestic water demand is based on a water demand factor of 0.38 gpm per EDU (Equivalent Dwelling Unit, residential units). The average daily demand for the proposed annexation of the Project is estimated to be 1,790 gpm or about 2,887 acre-feet/year (ac-ft/yr). The initial phase of the Project (Tract 30332) is estimated to be 330 gpm or about 532 acre-feet/year (ac-ft/yr). The Riverside County Fire department will stipulate the required fire flow requirement.

#### Fees

Fees such as facility fees are collected at the time a request for water service is made by the applicant for each proposed tract and a Water Main Extension and Facilities Construction Agreement with the District is executed. The fees are collected to secure funding for the purpose of constructing backbone master planned facilities. A component of the facility fees includes a new water source fee to construct or obtain additional water required as a result of the new development. Facility fees are based on domestic water usage per EDUs. The proposed initial phase of the Project (Tract 30332) is equivalent to 870 EDUs not including the proposed commercial site.

Other fees include connection and meter fees, which are paid by the developer at time of construction for each tract.

The present standard District charges are shown below. The charges are subject change. All facility fees and other charges will be at the rate at the time of execution of the Water Main Extension and Facilities Construction Agreement.

At the Regular Meeting of the Board of Directors held on October 12, 2016, Pardee Homes, Inc. request for extension of "Will Serve Letter" for the above referenced property (Tentative Tract Maps 31469 and 31470) was approved for domestic and non-potable (recycled) water service for the development of Tentative Tract Maps 31469 and 31470.

The Beaumont-Cherry Valley Water District will continue to provide water service to the subject properties continuing development assuming all obligations to provide service are met including but not limited to, the Rules and Regulations Governing Water Service as amended by the Board of Directors from time to time.

As identified in the October 6, 2016 Staff Report and prior to final project development the following conditions must be met.

- 1. The Applicant shall enter into a water facilities extension agreement and pay all fees associated with the domestic and non-potable (recycled) water service for each specific development area (Final Sub-Tracts within Tentative Tract Maps 31469 and 31470). The Applicant shall also pay all fees related to new fire service facilities including any facilities improvements that may be necessary to meet the fire flow requirements.
- 2. The Applicant shall pay front footage fees along all property frontages where facilities are currently installed.
- 3. The Applicant shall connect to the non-potable water system for irrigation supply. To minimize the use of potable water, the District requires the applicant conform to the City of Beaumont Landscaping

- b. Landscaping in non-turf areas should be drought tolerant consisting of planting materials. Irrigation systems for these areas should be drip or bubbler type.
- 4. The Applicant shall conform to all District requirements and all City of Beaumont requirements.
- 5. This project's Plan of Service as well as the District's Urban Water Management Plan identifies a water supply component for recycled water to be provided by the District that is procured from the City of Beaumont. The Applicant shall secure entitlement to said non-potable water supply from the City of Beaumont that shall be conveyed to the District as necessary to support the project development including non-potable water use requirements and to offset of potable water demand created by this project. Said non-potable water supply shall be provided to the District by the City at a delivered cost not to exceed the cost per acre-foot of imported water available from the State Water Project supply as available from the San Gorgonio Pass Water Agency current Table "A" Allotment (currently \$317 per acre foot of water). The water quality of said non-potable water shall meet all Title 22 and Basin Plan requirements.
- 6. The Applicant's project will impose additional water demands on the District's existing system. 

The proposed land uses are based on preliminary lotting studies of each planning area which have yielded the approximate amount of lots shown for each planning area respectively. The proposed ADD values in terms of gallons per capita per day have been reduced by 18% based on unit reductions observed from Coachella Valley Water District (CVWD) 2015 Urban Water Management Plan, Section 4. Multiple reasons for the assumed reduction in usage stem from more efficient landscape design, less turf in residential applications, and more efficient plumbing fixtures which have been driven by building standards and mandates.

The method has the following limitations and assumptions:

- The location of the water supply was not evaluated. Pressure zones and groundwater were not considered.
- The physical layout of the dwelling units was not evaluated. The ability to use of high-density residential developments may require a reduction in the land use area.
- The water use was evaluated for average day demands only. Maximum day demands and peaking factors were not evaluated.



#### SUBJECT: Consideration of Request for Extension of Will-Serve Letter for Previously-Approved Development: Tract 32850, a proposed 30-acre single-family residential development located at Assessor's Parcel No. 421-110-014 in the City of Beaumont

#### Staff Recommendation

Consider the request for an extension of "Will Serve Letter" for Tract 32850, a proposed 30-acre single-family residential development located in the City of Beaumont:

- A. Approve the request for extension of "Will Serve Letter" for Water Service for a final term of one year, without option for further extension
- B. Defer the request for extension of "Will Serve Letter" for Water Service pending resolution of securing agreement for supply of recycled water from the City of Beaumont, and securing a report of water supply conditions from the San Gorgonio Pass Water Agency
- C. Deny the request for extension of "Will Serve Letter" for Water Service

#### **Background**

The applicant, Steven H. Ritchey (Land Engineering Consultants, Inc.), has submitted the attached request for an updated "Will Serve Letter" dated March 30, 2018 on behalf of the property owners (Developers). This project has received four (4) previous "Will Serve Letter" updates in 2014, 2015, 2016 and 2017. The most recent "Will Serve Letter" extension for this project was approved at the District's May 18, 2017 Board Meeting and extended the expiration date of the previous "Will Serve Letter" for one year, to April 13, 2018.

The District's original project "Will Serve Letter" dated June 20, 2005, identifying the project as approved for annexation and water service by the Beaumont-Cherry Valley Water District Board of Directors, is attached for reference. Tract 32850 was annexed into the District's Service Area Boundary on August 18, 2006 under LAFCO Annexation 2005-105-2. Tract 32850 is identified in the District's 2013 Urban Water Management Plan Update.

In 2014, the Developer indicated they were requesting an extension to show continued project approval to building partners with whom the Developer was then negotiating to construct the project. In 2015 and 2016, the developer indicated they were requesting a second and third extension with expectations that the project would move forward. Last year, in 2017, the developer indicated they were requesting and becoming profitable.

Subsequent to issuance of the July 15, 2016 "Will Serve Letter" extension, the developer also identified issues with the project construction documents that required correction. In 2015-2016, the developer discovered grading design issues specifically relating to project requirements for



imported fill and associated retaining walls necessary to accommodate the proposed project grading. Due to these issues, the developer re-designed the project grading plan. This re-design affected the water and non-potable water improvement plans vertical alignment and required redesign of those plans. The District approved the final re-designed water and recycled water improvement plans on February 22, 2017. This represented the second update to the original improvement plans which were approved by the District on September 9, 2007.

In order to clarify if this fifth "Will Serve Letter" extension request would actually prove to be the period when the project moved forward, District Staff has set conditions to be met by the Developer in order to obtain Board approval for a fifth extension to the "Will Serve Letter." The Developer was required to submit a preliminary schedule detailing all steps leading up to and including construction of the project. In addition, the District requested a copy of a reported agreement between all owners and their building partner to give the District confidence in the project actually moving forward during this fifth extension. District staff recommends that in the event this "Will Serve Letter" extension is granted, this request be considered the final extension of said "Will Serve Letter" to be offered by the Board for this project, since this project has not moved to construction since originally approved 12 years ago.

Tract 32850 associated dwelling units are set forth as follows:

The requested "Will Serve Letter" update includes domestic (potable) water service and nonpotable (recycled) water service as part of the Development of Tract 32850. The Applicant has secured the final project approvals from the City of Beaumont. The impact of this development on the District's water supply system is identified in the District's 2016 Urban Water Management Plan.

Should the Board approve the extension of the "Will Serve Letter," the following will apply:

#### **Conditions of Development:**

Prior to final project development the following conditions must be met:

- 1. The Applicant shall enter into a water facilities extension agreement and pay all fees associated with the domestic and non-potable water services for the Project. The Applicant shall also pay all fees related to new fire service facilities including any facilities improvements that may be necessary to meet the fire flow requirements.
- 2. The Applicant shall pay front footage fees along all property frontages where facilities are currently installed.
- 3. The Applicant shall connect to the non-potable water system for irrigation supply. To minimize the use of potable water, the District requires the applicant conform to the City of Beaumont Landscaping Ordinances and Zoning Requirements and/or County of Riverside Landscaping Ordinances (whichever is applicable) which pertain to water efficient landscape requirements and the following:
  - a. Landscaped areas which have turf, shall have "smart irrigation controllers" which use Evapotranspiration (ET) data to automatically control the watering. Systems shall have an automatic rain sensor to prevent watering during and shortly after



rainfall and automatically determine watering schedule based on weather conditions, and not require seasonal monitoring changes. Orchard areas, if any, shall have drip irrigation.

- b. Landscaping in non-turf areas should be drought tolerant consisting of planting materials. Irrigation systems for these areas should be drip or bubbler type.
- 4. The Applicant shall conform to all District requirements and all City of Beaumont requirements.

#### Fiscal Impact:

Current Table "A" Allotment (currently \$317 per acre foot of water). The water quality of said non-potable water shall meet all Title 22 and Basin Plan requirements.
- The Applicant's project will impose additional water demands on the District's existing system which will be required to be supplied from imported water obtained from the San Gorgonio Pass Water Agency and non-potable (recycled) water obtained from the City of Beaumont, YVWD or other sources.



#### SUBJECT: Consideration of Approval of Request for Extension of Water Service "Will Serve Letter" for the Desert Pass development located at Assessor's Parcel No. 414-142-038 (1109 Elm Street) per Tract No. 33680

#### Staff Recommendation

Consider a one-year extension of the previously issued water service "Will Serve Letter" for domestic water service for the Riverside County Assessor's Parcel Number 414-142-038 (1109 Elm Street) per Tract Map 33680:

- A. Approve the request for extension of "Will Serve Letter" for Water Service
- B. Defer the request for extension of "Will Serve Letter" for Water Service pending resolution of security agreement for supply of recycled water from the City of Beaumont, and securing a report of water supply conditions from the San Gorgonio Pass Water Agency
- C. Deny the request for extension of "Will Serve Letter" for Water Service

#### **Background**

Refer to the Applicant's (Desert Pass, LLC / John A. Russo) attached request for an extension of water service "Will Serve Letter" for Tract Map 33680. This item was originally approved at the May 18, 2017 Board Meeting.

Said Tract 33680 consists of 24 single family homes proposed to occupy an existing infill lot within the City of Beaumont. This project site is shown on Figure 1 – 1109 Elm Street, Riverside County Assessors No. (APN) 414-142-038. This property is within the District's Service Area Boundary.

The Applicant, John Russo, submitted plans (attached) in March 2007 which were prepared by his Engineer (HL Development Engineering and Surveying) and were originally approved by the District on October 2, 2007. District files support the fact that these plans were checked by the District's Consultant (Parsons Engineering) between November 2006 and February 2007. Prior to final approval of the project, District Staff will require that said plans are updated.

As part of this "Will Serve Letter" extension request, the District requested the Applicant provide justification as to why the project has not moved forward since the "Will Serve Letter" was issued. The request for a justification is to assure the District that the project will move forward if the extension is granted.

On April 23, 2018, the Applicant responded with the justification, stating that last year they were unsuccessful in securing bonding to offset the cost of infrastructure for the project. The applicant explained that the current projected sales prices for the single family homes have now reached a point of projected profitability and the final map is being prepared for recordation.



Tract 33680 associated dwelling units are set forth as follows:

TractDwelling Units or EDUs3368024 DU

#### **Conditions of Development:**

In the event the Board selects Option A, above, during the continued project development the following conditions must be met:

- 1. The Applicant shall resubmit plans for update and subsequent District approval to show all existing easements, existing utilities, and to ensure the project meets current District Requirements.
- 2. The Applicant shall enter into a water facilities extension agreement and pay all fees associated with the domestic water services. The Applicant shall also pay all fees related to new fire service facilities including any facilities improvements that may be necessary to meet the fire flow requirements.
- 3. To minimize the use of potable water, the District requires that the applicant conform to the City of Beaumont and/or the County of Riverside Landscaping Ordinances which pertain to water efficient landscape requirements and the following:
  - a. Landscaped areas which have turf, shall have "smart irrigation controllers" which use Evapotranspiration (ET) data to automatically control the watering. Systems shall have an automatic rain sensor to prevent watering during and shortly after rainfall. Automatically determine watering schedule based on weather conditions, and not require seasonal monitoring changes. Orchard areas, if any, shall have drip irrigation.
  - b. Landscaping in non-turf areas should be drought tolerant consisting of planting materials similar to that at the District's demonstration garden at the Groundwater Recharge site. Irrigation systems for these areas should be drip or bubbler type.
- 4. The Applicant shall conform to all District requirements and all City of Beaumont requirements.

#### **Fiscal Impact:**

None. All fees and deposits will be paid by the Applicant prior to providing service.

- 4. Board defined alternative.

# Background:

Refer to the Applicant's (Desert Pass, LLC / John A. Russo) attached request for a "Will Serve Letter" For Tract Map 33680. This item was presented to the Board last month at the April 12, 2017 Board Meeting with Staff's understanding that the Applicant felt they would be able to produce a previous project "Will Serve Letter". The Board took action at that meeting to defer consideration of this project until more information regarding any previous "Will Serve Letter" was available.

Subsequent to the District's April 12, 2017 Board Meeting, the Applicant has further reviewed their files and determined that they are unable to locate a previous District "Will Serve Letter".

In addition, and as identified at that Board Meeting, District Staff was also unable to locate a "Will Serve Letter" in District files, nor was District Staff able to locate a record of this project requesting service from the District in District Board Meeting Agendas or Board Meeting Minutes from 2004 to 2008 (the period that the applicant took ownership of the property and processed plans through the District). Based upon these facts, the Applicant has requested that the project be presented to the Board to request a new "Will Serve Letter" for this project.

Said Tract 33680 consists of 23 single family homes proposed to occupy an existing infill lot within the City of Beaumont, CA. This project site is shown on Figure 1 – 1109 Elm Street, Riverside County Assessors No. (APN) 414-142-038. This property is within the District's Service Area Boundary.



The Applicant, John Russo, submitted plans (attached) in March 2017 which were prepared by his Engineer (HL Development Engineering and Surveying) and approved by the District on October 2, 2007. District files support the fact that these plans were plan checked by the District's Consultant (Parsons Engineering) between November 2006 and February 2007.

Based upon these facts, it is District Staff's belief that no "Will Serve Letter" was issued for this project, however project water improvement plans were reviewed and approved by the District.

Staff identifies there are four options available to the Board regarding approval of project water service ("Will Serve Letter") as follows:

- 1. Approve the Applicant's request for "Will Serve Letter".
- 2. Defer the Applicant's request for "Will Serve Letter" until the Water Capacity Fee Agreement between the District and the San Gorgonio Pass Water Agency (SGPWA) for new regional water supply (imported water supply) is finalized. A draft of that agreement was prepared by the District and submitted to the SGPWA
- 3. Deny the applicants request for water service.
- 4. Board defined alternative.

In the event the Board elects to approve the Applicant's request for "Will Serve Letter" (Option 1 above, the following Conditions of Development will apply.

#### **Conditions of Development:**

In the event Option 1, above, is selected, and during the continued project development the following conditions must be met:

- 1. The Applicant shall enter into a water facilities extension agreement and pay all fees associated with the domestic water services. The Applicant shall also pay all fees related to new fire service facilities including any facilities improvements that may be necessary to meet the fire flow requirements.
- 2. The Applicant shall resubmit plans for update and subsequent District approval to show all existing easements, existing utilities, and to ensure the project meets current District Requirements.
- 3. To minimize the use of potable water, the District requires that the applicant conform to the City of Beaumont and/or the County of Riverside Landscaping Ordinances which pertains to water efficient landscape requirements and the following:
  - a. Landscaped areas which have turf, shall have "smart irrigation controllers" which use Evapotranspiration (ET) data to automatically control the watering. Systems shall have an automatic rain sensor to prevent watering during and shortly after rainfall. Automatically determine watering schedule based on weather conditions, and not require seasonal monitoring changes. Orchard areas, if any, shall have drip irrigation.
  - b. Landscaping in non-turf areas should be drought tolerant consisting of planting materials similar to that at the District's demonstration garden at the Groundwater Recharge site. Irrigation systems for these areas should be drip or bubbler type.



4. The Applicant shall conform to all District requirements and all City of Beaumont requirements.

# Fiscal Impact:

There will be no fiscal impact to the District as all the fees and deposits will be paid for by the Applicant.

# **STAFF REPORT**

SUBJECT: Consideration of Proposed Amendment to District Policies and Procedures Manual, Part II, Section 5A: Regular Meetings to add one monthly Board of Directors Regular Meeting and / or change Regular Meeting Time

# Staff Recommendation

No recommendation. Direct staff as desired.

# **Background**

Under California Government Code 54954.2 (the Brown Act), a "Regular Meeting" is a meeting occurring at the dates, times and location set by resolution, ordinance or other formal action by the legislative body.

In March of 2009, the Board adopted Resolution 2009-05, which changed the Regular Meeting of the Board of Directors from the second Tuesday of every month to the second Wednesday of every month.

#### <u>Summary</u>

The Board wishes to consider the addition of one Regular Meeting (known as an "Engineering Workshop") per month to the District's docket. This would result in a potential increase of six or more meetings annually, for a combined total of 24 regular meetings per year. Currently, such workshops are called by the Board President on an intermittent as-needed basis, approximately bi-monthly (six times per year).

The Board also wishes to consider changing the time of Call to Order of the regular meetings from 7:00 p.m. to an earlier time.

It is important to note that the District's Policies and Procedures Manual, Part II, Section 5A states that:

The date, time and place of regular Board meetings may be reconsidered annually at the annual organizational meeting of the Board.

Per the District's Policies and Procedures Manual, Part II, Section 5D, the annual organizational meeting is the December meeting.

Regardless of said policy, the Board may make such changes as desired by adoption of a Resolution amending the current policy. At today's meeting, the Board may discuss and direct



staff to prepare for publication a Resolution defining any desired changes, then if desired, may vote on said Resolution at the June 13, 2018 regular meeting.

The meeting schedule will be effective after publication of the proposed Resolution once a week for two successive weeks in newspapers published in Riverside County and in San Bernardino County (Water Code Section 21378). If the Board chooses to adopt a Resolution at the June 13 meeting, any changes to the regular meeting schedule would be effective starting with the July 2018 meetings.

# Fiscal Impact

The estimated administrative cost of one regular meeting is \$6,469. The addition of six meetings per year would result in costs to the District of approximately \$38,814.

Approximate costs per meeting

- Director expenses
   Directors each receive a per diem of \$200 for each meeting. If all five directors attend six additional meetings per year, the annual cost to the District will increase by \$6,000.
- Legal Counsel expenses

There will be additional expenses for attendance of Legal Counsel including time and travel, estimated to be approximately \$1,781 per meeting. Multiplied by six additional meetings: \$10,686. The Board may choose not to have legal counsel present at workshop meetings.

• Labor expenses

Additional staff / labor costs will include overtime for attendance and administrative support at evening meetings, additional staff time to prepare Board agenda packets and meeting minutes, and ready the Board room. No budget increase would be requested; the time necessary for meetings would be absorbed by departmental budgets and resources allocated to tasks necessary.

# SUBJECT: Consideration of Potential Security Strategies for the Noble Creek Recharge Facility Phase I

# Staff Recommendation

No recommendation. Direct staff as desired.

# **Background**

The Noble Creek Recharge Facility, Phase I and Phase 2 is an approximately 82-acre site located on the east side of Beaumont Avenue between Cherry Valley Boulevard and Brookside Avenue. Phase I is approximately 28.5 acres and is accessible to the public (vehicle traffic is restricted at the end of every business day) 24 hours a day. Phase 2 is approximately 53.5 acres, consisting of both spreading basins and a 2.0 mg reservoir.

Phase 1 is currently open to the public from sunrise to sunset. The intent of the BCVWD was to allow day use of the property for community park purposes. The northwest corner of the property is open space, with picnic tables and barbecues. The interior of the recharge facility is also open to vehicle and foot traffic, with pathways among the ponds, more picnic benches, trashcans and a park-like walkway along the edge of Noble Creek.

# <u>Summary</u>

At its meeting of April 18, 2018, the Board discussed the following options for facility security:

- A. Fencing, chain link. A climb-resistant top feature other than razor wire or barbed wire is to be investigated. Staff to provide detailed specifications on the fencing material and fence line location.
- B. Removal of the picnic tables and barbecues.
- C. Permanently prohibit public access to the site in its entirety.

Concerns voiced by Board members included the following topics:

- A. Risk / liability mitigation
- B. Pedestrian access via climbing of fence
- C. Maintenance of landscaping
- D. Fence aesthetics due to proximity of residential area



At the April 18, 2018 Engineering Workshop, the Board of Directors directed staff to agendize this item for further discussion at the May 9, 2018 Regular Board Meeting in an effort to provide direction to staff and to confer with the District's legal counsel.

# Fiscal Impact

# SECTION 02831 BASIC CHAIN LINK FENCE SPECIFICATIONS

#### PART 1 - GENERAL

#### **1.01** General Requirements

- A. Contractor shall furnish all labor, materials, and equipment and perform all operations necessary for construction of chain link fences including gates to the sizes, lines, and grades specified.
- B. Unless specified otherwise, chain link fence (fabric) shall be six (6) feet in height and it shall be topped by three (3) strands of barbed wire supported by post top arms; posts shall not be placed at more than ten (10) foot intervals and continuous top rails shall be provided; fabric shall be placed on outside of post line.

#### 1.02 Submittals

Contractor shall submit shop drawings in accordance with the Contractor Submittals Technical Specifications and shall include, but not be limited to the following:

- A. A list of all materials required for fence construction. The list shall include manufacturer's name, designation, description, and related data.
- B. Catalog data together with dimension drawings of fence components, including latches, stops, keepers, and related hardware.

#### **PART 2 - PRODUCTS**

#### 2.01 Materials

All materials and fittings shall be new and all ferrous materials shall be galvanized. All base material shall be of commercial quality. All weights shall be subject to standard mill tolerance  $(5\% \pm)$ .

#### A. Chain Link Fabric

Steel chain link fence fabric shall be zinc coated and shall conform to requirements of ASTM A392, latest. Wire used in the manufacture of the fabric shall be 11 gage for all fences less than 72" in height, and 9 gage for all fences 72" in height or over. Fabric shall have twisted and barbed finish on both edges for widths of 60 inches and over. Barbing shall be achieved by cutting end wires on bias. Fabric shall have knuckled finish on top edge and twisted and barbed finish on bottom edge for widths of less than 60 inches. All fabric shall have 2 inch mesh which shall be galvanized after fabrication.

#### B. Posts, Braces, Rails, and Appurtenances

Posts, braces, and rails shall be manufactured from galvanized standard weight pipe conforming to ASTM A 53, latest, except as modified herein. Posts shall be equipped with tight fitting tops or caps.

Post tops, top arms, stretcher, bars, stretcher bar bands, and all other fittings and hardware shall be steel malleable iron or wrought iron, galvanized, and shall conform to ASTM A 153, latest, except as modified herein. Nuts and bolts may be cadmium or zinc plated.

End, corner and line posts, braces, and rails shall conform to the following:

Walk gate posts shall conform to the requirements specified above for end and corner posts and drive gate posts shall conform to the following:

Stretcher bars shall be 1/4 inch by 3/4 inch steel and stretcher bar bands shall be 1/8 inch by 1 inch steel. Truss or tension rods shall be 3/8 inch diameter steel adjustable with drop forged turnbuckles or suitable tightening devices.

Rail couplings shall be outside sleeve type, at least 7 inches in length, and sufficiently true to maintain alignment.

Barbed wire extension arms shall attach to post tops and carry three (3) wires at 5-1/2  $\pm 1/2$  inch centers at 45 degrees from vertical.

#### C. <u>Tension, Tie, and Barbed Wire</u>

Tension wire shall be 7 gage hard drawn steel springs wire, zinc coated, and it shall conform to ASTM A 227, latest.

Tie wire shall be 9 gage iron or steel wire, zinc coated, and it shall conform to ASTM A 112, latest.

Barbed wire shall conform to ASTM A 121, latest, and, unless specified otherwise, it shall consist of two strands of 12-1/2 gage wire twisted with 14 gage 4 point barbs spaced 5 inches apart. Barbed wire shall be galvanized in accordance with ASTM A 121, latest, Class I thereof.

D. <u>Gates</u>

Gate frames shall be comprised of galvanized standard weight pipe conforming to ASTM A 153, latest, except as modified herein. Gates shall be fabricated using welded construction. Gate frames shall be cross-trussed with 3/8 inch adjustable truss rods and they shall be equipped with horizontal stiffeners if 72 inches in height or higher and vertical stiffeners at 8 foot centers maximum.

Gates shall be swing type, supported by two malleable iron hinges not less than 3 inches in width. Gate hardware shall be steel, malleable iron or wrought iron, galvanized, and shall conform to ASTM A 153, latest, except as modified herein. Hinges shall clamp to gate post and permit gate to swing back 180 degrees. Bottom hinge shall consist of a ball and socket.

Gate frames shall conform to the following:

#### E. Latches, Stops, and Keepers

Latches, stops and keepers shall be heavy duty and they shall be compatible with gate posts and gates. Latches shall be positive type devices suitable for padlocking and they shall be provided with all gates. Center stops consisting of plunger rods or bars with catches set in concrete shall be provided with all double gates. Keepers consisting of semi-automatic mechanical devices shall be provided with all drive gates and shall secure free ends of gates in full open position when in use.

# **PART 3 - EXECUTION**

#### 3.01 Installation

All trees, brush, and other obstacles which interfere with construction of fencing shall be removed or relocated as directed by Owner. Ground surface shall be leveled so that fabric can be installed without ground interference. High points shall be excavated and low points shall be filled and compacted (85% relative compaction). Prior to fence construction bottom of fabric shall range between 1 and 2 inches above ground.

All posts shall be set vertically and at uniform height. They shall be set in Portland cement concrete footings (concrete Class 500-C-2500) in compliance with Section 201-1 of the Standard

Specification, latest. Said concrete shall be placed against undisturbed earth. Tops of footings shall be set level (flush) with surrounding ground, crowned, and troweled smooth to provide drainage. Diameters of footings shall be at least three times post diameters. Footing depths and post embedment shall be as follows:

End, corner, and gate posts shall be braced to the midpoint of the nearest line post or posts with horizontal braces used as compression members and trussed from the bottom to the line post or posts with 3/8 inch diagonal truss rods and drop-forged turnbuckles or other suitable tightening devices used as tension members. Changes in alignment or grade where the angle of deflection is 30 degrees or more shall be considered as corners, and corner posts, braces, and truss rods shall be installed.

All necessary braces, rails, truss rods, stretcher bars, and other fittings shall be fastened to posts neatly and securely. Malleable iron post tops shall be secured to posts and they shall carry top rails when required. If top tension wire is specified in lieu of top rails, line posts shall be braced and trussed in both directions at intervals of no more than 1,000 feet as specified above for corner posts.

Fabric shall be stretched taut and securely fastened to end, corner, or gate posts with stretcher bars and stretcher bar bands spaced at 15 inch intervals maximum and to line posts at 16 inch intervals maximum. Top edge of fabric shall be fastened to top rail so that fabric projects above said rail, or top tension wire, if specified and bottom edge of fabric shall be fastened to bottom tension wire. Top and bottom edges shall be fastened at 18 inch intervals maximum. Tension wires shall be stretched tight with drop-forged turnbuckles.

Gate fabric shall be attached horizontally with top of gate level with top of adjoining fence and plumb. Unless specified otherwise, gates shall line up with adjoining fence on either side.

All fences shall be constructed in a workmanlike manner. All fencing materials shall be securely fastened, tight, and true. All gates shall open, close, lock, and stop with ease.
