Public Comment:

Vice President Slawson identified Mr. Hendrick Becker and read a letter into the record:

Dear Mr. Chairman,

I am writing you and the Board to respectfully request a variance in the requirements submitted to me in my request for service at 9584 Avenida Miravilla, Cherry Valley. In order for me to receive service, I have to do an eight-inch main line extension of 230 feet along the front of my property, as well as to install a new fire hydrant.

The property behind me is already receiving service with the line running through my property to get there. The Fire Department already cleared my permit to build based on the existing fire flow data and with the added sprinkler requirements involved. My manufactured house will arrive in the first week of July.

If no variance is possible, may I request for you to consider a bond that I pay towards the future extension project, so that I can just receive the service needed at my house at this time.

VP Slawson explained that staff has been working with Mr. Hendrick and this item is not on the agenda. Mr. Jaggers advised the Board that District policy allows a brief response to public comment and explained that the Water Master Plan requires the extension of mainlines in the area. Mr. Becker thanked the Board and said that it is his understanding that it is not unusual to post a bond towards an extension and he requests consideration, if not tonight, on the next meeting agenda. President Covington noted that Mr. Becker's letter dated June 11, 2019 is received and filed and directed staff to include this item on the next agenda.

3. Discussion and Consideration of Final Draft Memorandum of Understanding Regarding Recycled Water by and between the Beaumont-Cherry Valley Water District and the City of Beaumont

General Manager Dan Jaggers pointed out some minor changes arising from the joint meeting of the City of Beaumont and BCVWD Board. He noted one substantive change: language from the city related to water reuse, recharge and future facilities was modified to better accommodate those activities and treatment facilities to be funded from a range of sources.

Director Hoffman asked if water received at the BCWVD's booster pump is treated to the level necessary for spread in the recharge ponds. Mr. Jaggers explained the City's agreement with the State Water Resources Control Board and the Santa Ana Watershed Project Authority and said in the near-term, the water will be treated to a higher quality required by BCVWD, but there are new regulations being

pursued regarding groundwater quality and until there is some hydrogeologic groundwater modeling, it is unknown from a quality perspective. Jaggers indicated that BCVWD would likely add treatment in order to recharge. He also noted that the Beaumont-Cherry Valley Recreation and Park District uses approximately 50 to 70 acre-feet of water each year and will convert to use of recycled water. If there are more customers for the recycled water, Jaggers continued, it does not have to be recharged. In the wintertime, Hoffman noted, demand for irrigation water is 80 percent lower. He said his goal is to recoup and use all the recycled water. Mr. Jaggers assured there are plans for the supply.

President Covington asked about fixed costs that will be charged to the District by the City. Mr. Jaggers explained this is related to delivery costs. There will be a cost study, Jaggers noted. Counsel Markman pointed out the City will not collect this money and spend the cash; this is an amortized cost of something that is already built. Jaggers added that this sets forth costs to allow for future planning. Director Hoffman noted the importance of this section and suggested it be further discussed.

Mr. Jaggers indicated that at this point, the facility must be built and there are costs associated. Director Hoffman pointed out that the City is one of the largest consumers of recycled water, so it is to their advantage to keep costs down. Counsel Markman said he had been concerned the City was going to amortize the entire treatment plant against recycled water, but the current language assures inclusion of only the facilities necessary to get recycled water to BCVWD. He believes the language is adequate.

In response to President Covington, Mr. Jaggers said the City will be addressing this item on June 18.

Mr. Jaggers reviewed additional amendments on the redline. Counsel Markman pointed out the use of the word "latter" instead of "later." Director Ramirez referred to the non-potable water plan and said he does not want to see the water being treated to the level of potable re-use. Director Hoffman advised that some citizens believe the City may be making an effort to profit from the treatment of sewage. The water belongs to the ratepayers until the point it leaves their homes; from there the City has the responsibility of transporting and processing the water, and the District has the responsibility of receiving and recharging or reusing it. Hoffman reiterated that the District has the first right of refusal for purchasing all the recycled water produced by the City.

VP Slawson and President Covington acknowledged staff for getting this done. Director Ramirez stressed that this is a very positive move forward for the entire system and for sustainability.

Dr. Blair Ball expressed concern that the recycled water would become too costly to sell. He noted that the water itself should be free. The citizens have paid BCVWD to secure water to their home, and the citizens then pay the City of Beaumont to dispose of the water. At that point, the water becomes free, as it has been paid for twice, Ball said. To have a City add more cost to that water is worrisome, he said. President Covington assured that the Board shares the concern about costs.

4. Consideration of Request for "Will Serve Letter" for Proposed Housing Project - Allegheny Avenue (Riverside County Assessor's Parcel No. 419-150-050) located north of 6th Street and south of 8th Street in the City of Beaumont

General Manager Jaggers explained the project consists of 48 multi-family dwelling units and the developer, Linc Housing Corporation, is requesting service. A water main extension will likely be required. Jaggers reiterated that if water supply plans come to fruition the District is in reasonable shape but there is some uncertainty.

Director Ramirez noted the project will be required to use recycled water for irrigation. President Covington added that there is not likely recycled water available in the vicinity. Mr. Jaggers explained that approximately 2,000 feet of recycled water main may be necessary.

Director Hoffman pointed out there is existing low-income housing in the vicinity.

5. Consideration of Request for "Will Serve Letter" for Riverside County Assessor's Parcel No. 403-042-034 located at 10271 Cherry Avenue in the Community of Cherry Valley

General Manager Jaggers presented the request and noted conditions of approval. Director Williams asked about the site plan. Mr. Jaggers responded. Director Ramirez asked about requirements for recycled water; Mr. Jaggers stated that the District does not currently require dual plumbing on single residential facilities. Additionally, the City ordinance prohibits use of turf on new housing developments. He explained the non-potable water system, indicating it is not prudent to saddle ratepayers with large depreciation and maintenance costs to expand the system.

6. Consideration of Request for "Will Serve Letter" for Riverside County Assessor's Parcel No. 403-110-019 located at 10521 Noble Street in the Community of Cherry Valley

General Manager Jaggers reviewed the development plan to add a new house. There is an existing house; this would be a second service to the property. BCVWD policy states that a structure more than 1,200 square feet requires a second meter, and this does not fall under the "granny flat" laws that preclude the District from charging additional fees.

Jaggers pointed out that the amount of landscaping is reduced with two dwelling units on one property, therefore landscape water use and overall use decreases. Director Hoffman reported that the house is currently under construction and the builder was unaware that a second meter was required. Mr. Jaggers advised the builder had requested service.

7. Update and Discussion regarding the Beaumont Master Drainage Plan Line 16

General Manager Jaggers presented background on the project. District staff has met with Riverside County Flood Control and work is moving forward on a Memorandum of Understanding. Design is 30 percent complete, Jaggers noted, and the effort has picked up speed. BCVWD has a concept but has not begun drafting plans.

The District does not want to slow the project and was offered an opportunity to contract with Flood Control's approved contractor for \$40,000 to \$50,000. Mr. Jaggers stated this makes sense right now due to District staff time on other projects, and to provide cohesion on the project, as that contractor has already

done the hydraulic analysis and has the data. If the Board has no issue with this option, staff will obtain a scope of work.

This would be a variance from the regular purchasing policy, Jaggers noted. Senior Engineer Mark Swanson added some technical details and recommended leveraging the opportunity to work with Flood Control.

Director Ramirez asked how many acre-feet of stormwater are estimated to be captured. Mr. Jaggers said as much as 500 acre-feet may be available; staff believes it may be 250 to 400 acre-feet of water supply, presuming it can all be recharged.

President Covington indicated he reviewed his notes from the discussion of this project in July 2017 and indicated he hopes the issues are addressed as the District gets closer to finalizing the plan.

GM Jaggers asked for Board direction and assured that any contact will be brought back to the Board for final approval. Director Ramirez indicated that this solution saves money and staff time. Director Hoffman noted that recovering 500 acre-feet is preferable to buying 500 acre-feet at \$399 per acre-feet. The cost would be recovered in seven to nine years. He pointed out there is some grant funding for this project; Mr. Jaggers noted that a facilities fee component is collected from development and those funds will also support this project.

President Covington noted the intent is to have a final draft MOU and confirmed that the costs to the District will be between \$1.39 and \$1.89 million. Mr. Swanson confirmed that number represented the District's 50 percent share. Anything further, such as improvements to the Noble Creek Recharge Facility, are costs to the District, Covington clarified.

8. Discussion and Presentation Regarding Bogart Park by Duane Burk, General Manager of Beaumont-Cherry Valley Recreation and Park District

This item was tabled.

9. Reports For Discussion

a. Ad Hoc Committees:

San Gorgonio Pass Regional Water Alliance: Director Slawson reported that the Committee met and discussed pass-through fees. Some of the numbers were astronomical, he noted. Revisions will be available in the future. The Committee meets again on the 26th to determine a new Chair.

Finance and Audit Committee: Director Slawson reported on the June 11 meeting. He indicated the District's finances are good and are on track for the year.

2x2 Recycled Water Committee: Director Hoffman indicated there have been no recent meetings.

b. General Manager:

Mr. Jaggers advised that things are going well. He presented a chart comparing this year's production to last year's, stating the numbers reflect that it has been a cool year with a lot of rain. Production from the Beaumont Basin is down 942

acre-feet from last year. Production has been increased in Edgar Canyon by 151 acre-feet, saving \$60,000 in replenishment costs, GM Jaggers stated, and he reminded the board about the work done on those wells and the line break caused by the Pass Agency. Banning's production from the Beaumont Basin is 24.66 acre-feet.

Staff is trying to find the most economical solutions and is determining the cost to pump each well, Jaggers explained.

Jaggers reminded the Board about activities at the Noble Creek facility. He said the facility is currently running at 30 cfs which is 58.8 acre-feet per day (19,600 acre-feet of water delivery over 11 months). The replenishment need right now is approximately 9,000 acre-feet, he explained. The ponds are at 40 to 50 percent capacity. On June 11, Jaggers said, he received an email from San Gorgonio Pass Water Agency General Manager Jeff Davis notifying BCVWD that the SGPWA will not be able to deliver more than 23 cfs in the future as there is not capacity in the pipeline. This is disappointing, Jaggers noted, as 3,500 acre-feet has already been lost from the San Luis Reservoir, and now the District is constrained to 23 cfs. Jaggers estimated that through December, 7,500 acre-feet can be obtained. The District had ordered 16,000 acre-feet this year. There is also talk about shutting down the East Branch Extension in December, he noted. The District may not receive all the water ordered this year.

President Covington summarized that BCVWD installed a 34 cfs connection but now can receive no more than 23 cfs.

Jaggers noted the SGPWA has a 20 cfs facility that should have been completed in January. Jaggers said he suggested to Mr. Davis that he run some water through to determine hydraulic capacity.

Mr. Jaggers explained that he has heard that the SGPWA is awaiting a change order for reconnection of the temporary feed that was installed. The plans that were bid did not show the reconnection, and the change was made in February. Mr. Jaggers documented the work done outside scope in a letter and noted some discrepancies. BCVWD did not participate in the decision and did not authorize the work as a funding agency, so BCVWD should not have the exposure of it, he stated.

Additionally, BCVWD experienced a break on a 12-inch water line requiring three lengths of pipe to be replaced by SGPWA's contractor. Jaggers sent the request via email in an effort to protect the District's assets.

Mr. Jaggers advised there have been meetings with the cities regarding the push by the SGPWA to look again at a capacity fee. Mr. Jaggers said he explained the BCWVD's needs from the Sites Reservoir at one of the meetings.

The SGPWA has indicated there may be an East Branch Extension shutdown in December. This would be detrimental to the District's water delivery this year, Jaggers noted.

General Manager Jaggers updated the Board on the leased space for Engineering staff, who moved in about a week ago.

c. Directors' Reports:

Director Williams reported she attended the Bay-Delta Tour.

Director Ramirez reported he has been working with the General Manager and CV Strategies to be more proactive on communicating activities.

President Covington reported that he, Director Williams and Director Slawson attended the Bay-Delta Tour last week. He gave some detail and recommended it as a very good tour.

Director Slawson concurred with Covington's comments on the Bay-Delta Tour and added that it covered five counties, and 20+ agencies. He thanked the Board for the opportunity to learn about the source of the area's water.

d. Legal Counsel Report:

Counsel Markman reported that last month, Richards Watson and Gershon became the general legal counsel for the Antelope Valley-East Kern Water Agency, which will enable the provision of a more robust water rights department at the firm.

SUBJECT: Consideration of Proposed Revision to BCVWD's "Will Serve Letter" Policy

(tabled from June 27, 2019 Engineering Workshop)

Staff Recommendation

Information and consideration.

Background

At the May 23, 2019 Beaumont-Cherry Valley Engineering Workshop, members of the Board directed staff to evaluate Beaumont-Cherry Valley Water District's current "Will Serve Letter" (WSL) Policy with regard to subsequent updates or extensions after Board approval.

District staff has reviewed the current Policy, Section 8-1.2 (attached) of the Beaumont-Cherry Valley Water District Regulations Governing Water Service, and said Policy and states the following:

8-1.2 WILL SERVE LETTERS – Will be subject to approval of the Board and to all Rules and Regulations of the District at the time water service actually occurs, and if granted will be based on available new source of supply, including but not limited to new groundwater, imported water, or reclamation water for irrigation, used to offset existing local groundwater demand."

The BCVWD Water Service Application Process, adopted on April 01, 2011 and attached (page 6 of 14), further states:

Once Board approval has been granted, the developer will have 1 year to begin the project. If the project has not started within 1 year the Applicant shall request an extension in writing to the General Manager. General Manager may choose to extend the deadline or end the development process.

Currently, as well as during the term of the previous three (3) General Managers, the District has provided all Developer "Will Serve Letter" original letter or extension letters to the Board for review and consideration to ensure the Board actively participates in all "Will Serve Letter" extensions.

If the Board elects to modify the District's existing policy, District staff proposes the following addition be added to Section 8-1.2:

Once Board approval has been granted, the Applicant will have one (1) year to begin the project. If the project has not started within one (1) year, the Applicant shall request an extension in writing to the General Manager. The General Manager is authorized by the Board to grant a single one (1) year extension, otherwise any subsequent "Will Serve Letter" extension(s) shall be approved by the Board of Directors.



Should the Board desire the above addition to the BCVWD Regulations Governing Water Service Section 8-1.2, staff will prepare a Resolution for the next Board meeting.

Fiscal Impact

There would be minimal fiscal impact to the District. All staff time and administration costs are charged to deposits and fees paid by the Applicants.

REGULATIONS GOVERNING WATER SERVICE

PART 8 ANNEXATION AND WATER MAIN EXTENSION

- 8-1 ANNEXATIONS
- 8-1.1 GENERAL PROVISIONS
- 8-1.2 WILL SERVE LETTERS Will be subject to approval of the Board and to all Rules and Regulations of the District at the time water service actually occurs, and if granted will be based on available new source of supply, including but not limited to new groundwater, imported water, or reclamation water for irrigation, used to offset existing local groundwater demand.
- 8-1.3 ANNEXATION TO THE DISTRICT Applicants for service to property lying outside the District boundaries will be required to annex such property to the District prior to receiving water service. Property proposed for annexation will be subject to administrative charges, facilities fees, and any other charges approved by the Board of Directors and applied on a District-wide basis as set forth in the District's Rules Governing Water Service. All annexations shall be completed within one (1) year of issuance of letter of intent to service (will serve letter). (Rev. 1-6-97)
- 8-1.4 ANNEXATION AGREEMENT Following annexation approval by the Local Agency Formation Commission, the applicant will enter into an Annexation Agreement establishing terms and conditions of administrative charges, facilities fees, and other related fees and charges approved by the Board of Directors and applied on a District-wide basis as set forth in the District's Rules Governing Water Service. The annexation agreement will establish any credits and reimbursements that may be applicable. All final agreement drafts shall be submitted to the Board of Directors for final approval. (Rev 1-6-97)
- 8-1.5 WATER MAIN EXTENSION AND FACILITIES CONSTRUCTION AGREEMENT Following completion of the annexation procedure and prior to development, the applicant shall enter into a Water Main Extension and Facilities Construction Agreement prepared by the district, including both "Applicant" and "District" obligations for system construction to serve the applicant's property.
- 8-1.6 CONSTRUCTED FACILITIES REIMBURSEMENT AGREEMENT The District, upon Board approval, may enter into a reimbursement agreement for any facilities or water system appurtenances required to be installed for off-site improvements necessary to serve the applicant's property. Any Board approved reimbursement agreement shall not exceed a period of ten (10) years from the date of installation. All reimbursements made by subsequent water users will be reimbursed to the applicant during the month of December in the year which the reimbursement was collected by the District. Any reimbursable balance remaining at the expiration of the ten (10) year period shall become the property of the District and no longer subject to refund.

- A project folder containing all information regarding the project will be created by Engineering Staff
- Water Supply Assessment (Engineering Staff)
 - o If a water supply assessment is required, Engineering Staff will prepare all necessary documents.
- Board approved letter of intent to serve (Board)
 - The General Manager will review the letter of intent to serve and supporting staff report and direct the Executive Assistant to place the documents on the next available board meeting agenda to seek Board of Directors approval. The Executive Assistant will notify the Applicant of the date and time of the meeting.
 - Once Board approval has been granted, the developer will have 1 year to begin the project. If the project has not started within 1 year the Applicant shall request an extension in writing to the General Manager. General Manager may choose to extend the deadline or end the development process.
 - The Executive Assistant informs the Business Office, Engineering Staff and the Applicant of the Board's approval or rejection.

Annexation

During the initial engineering meeting a determination will be made if annexation to the District is required. If annexation is required, the following steps shall be taken.

- Request for annexation (Applicant submits to Executive Assistant)
 - The Applicant must submit a letter requesting annexation to the District. Annexation requires Board of Directors approval. The request for annexation should be submitted along with the request for water service so the Board may approve both the letter of intent to serve and the annexation at the same board meeting. If the letter of intent to serve is not approved, then the annexation request will automatically be rejected.
 - The Executive Assistant places the request for annexation along with the intent to serve letter on the next available board meeting agenda, under the direction of the General Manager and notifies the Applicant of the date and time of the meeting.
- Board approval of annexation (Board)
 - Upon Board approval, the Executive Assistant will prepare a letter to the Applicant, notifying the Applicant of the Board's decision and notifies the Business Office and Engineering Staff of the Boards approval or rejection
- Annexation deposit (Applicant submits to the Business Office)
 - O An initial annexation deposit of \$5000 is required to cover any cost the District incurs as a result of the annexation process. This deposit only covers District costs and not LAFCO expenses. When the Application for Annexation is submitted to LAFCO, the LAFCO fees can be estimated and the Applicant shall deposit the estimated LAFCO fees with District's Business Office. Additional deposits may be required and the Applicant will be so notified by the Executive Assistant. Reference Policies and Procedures Part IV Section 8.3.
- Plan of Service (Engineering Staff)
 - The Engineering Staff will prepare the LAFCO required plan of service upon receipt of the initial deposit
 - o Engineering will provide a copy of the Plan of Service to the applicant.

Staff Recommendation

Consider the request for an update of "Will Serve Letter" for Parcel Map 32344 (located on Dutton Street, west of Cherry Avenue and east of Noble Street) in the Community of Cherry Valley.

- A. Approve the Application for Water Service and furnish an update of "Will Serve Letter" for water service, or;
- B. Deny the Application for an update of "Will Serve Letter" for water service

Background

The Applicant, Herald Lantis, has requested an update of "Will Serve Letter" on June 5, 2019 for PM 32344. This small infill development will subdivide an existing parcel which has an existing residence, into a total of four (4) parcels for a single-family residential development within the community of Cherry Valley. The original project, consisting of the undivided parcel, Assessor's Parcel No. (APN) 403-020-005, was issued a "Will Serve Letter" on May 27, 2004.

Said development includes a new cul-de-sac (Freedom Circle), in order to provide frontage to each parcel. The Applicant possesses approved plans dated January 10, 2007, that will require updating to meet current District standards and are currently in plan check.

The Applicant has indicated that they are eager to begin construction and plan to move quickly through the District's development approval process to begin construction as soon as possible.

Conditions

Prior to final project development, the following conditions must be met:

- 1. The Applicant shall enter into a water facilities extension agreement and pay all fees associated with the domestic water services. The Applicant shall also pay all fees related to new fire service facilities including any facilities improvements that may be necessary to meet the fire flow requirements.
- 2. The Applicant shall resubmit plans for update and subsequent District approval to show all existing easements, existing utilities, and to ensure the project meets current District Requirements.
- 3. To minimize the use of potable water, the District requires that the Applicant conform to the County of Riverside Landscaping Ordinances which pertains to water efficient landscape requirements and the following:



- a. Landscaped areas which have turf, shall have "smart irrigation controllers" which use Evapotranspiration (ET) data to automatically control the watering. Systems shall have an automatic rain sensor to prevent watering during and shortly after rainfall. Automatically determine watering schedule based on weather conditions, and not require seasonal monitoring changes. Orchard areas, if any, shall have drip irrigation.
- b. Landscaping in non-turf areas should be drought tolerant consisting of planting materials. Irrigation systems for these areas should be drip or bubbler type.
- 4. The Applicant shall conform to all District requirements and all County of Riverside requirements.

Fiscal Impact

None. All fees and deposits will be paid by the Applicant prior to providing service.

Avenue in the City of Beaumont

Staff Recommendation

Consider the request for an update of "Will Serve Letter" for Tract 33680 (Riverside County Assessor's Parcel No. [APN] 414-142-038) in the City of Beaumont.

- A. Approve the Application for Water Service and furnish an update of "Will Serve Letter", or;
- B. Deny the Application for an update of "Will Serve Letter for Water Service.

Background

The Applicant, Desert Pass, LLC / John A. Russo, has requested an update of "Will Serve Letter" for water service from the District for a proposed infill project consisting of 24 single family homes located within the City of Beaumont on June 24, 2019 for Tract Map 33680. This item was most recently approved by the Beaumont-Cherry Valley Board of Directors on July 11, 2017 and updated on August 28, 2018.

Although the July 11, 2017 approval was the first recorded approval of the request for water service for Tract Map 33680, District staff identified that the Applicant has previously submitted plans which were plan checked by the District's Consultant (Parsons Engineering) between November 2006 and February 2007. However, during the research and preparation for the July 11, 2017 Staff Report, District staff was unable to locate an approved "Will Serve Letter" concluded that a "Will Serve Letter" had never been issued for Tract Map 33680.

Said Tract 33680 consists of 24 single family homes proposed to occupy an existing infill lot located south of Lana Way, north of Rena Way and west of Elm Avenue in the City of Beaumont, CA. This project site is shown on Figure 1 – APN 414-142-038 and is within the District's Service Area Boundary.

The Applicant, John Russo, submitted plans (attached) which were prepared by his Engineer (HL Development Engineering and Surveying) and originally approved by the District on October 2, 2007. The District has requested the Applicant resubmit the October 2, 2007 approved plans to the District to verify all current District standards are adhered to.

Conditions of Development:

Prior to final project development the following conditions must be met:

- The Applicant shall enter into a water facilities extension agreement and pay all fees associated with the domestic water services. The Applicant shall also pay all fees related to new fire service facilities including any facilities improvements that may be necessary to meet the fire flow requirements.
- 2. The Applicant shall resubmit plans for update and subsequent District approval to show all existing easements, existing utilities, and to ensure the project meets current District Requirements.
- 3. To minimize the use of potable water, the District requires that the applicant conform to the City of Beaumont and/or the County of Riverside Landscaping Ordinances which pertains to water efficient landscape requirements and the following:
 - a. Landscaped areas which have turf, shall have "smart irrigation controllers" which use Evapotranspiration (ET) data to automatically control the watering. Systems shall have an automatic rain sensor to prevent watering during and shortly after rainfall. Automatically determine watering schedule based on weather conditions, and not require seasonal monitoring changes. Orchard areas, if any, shall have drip irrigation.
 - b. Landscaping in non-turf areas should be drought tolerant consisting of planting materials. Irrigation systems for these areas should be drip or bubbler type.
- 4. The Applicant shall conform to all District requirements and all City of Beaumont requirements.

Fiscal Impact:

None. All fees and deposits will be paid by the Applicant prior to providing service.

At the regular meeting of the Beaumont-Cherry Valley Water District Board of Directors held on May 9, 2018, the Desert Pass LLC's request for a water service letter ("Will Serve Letter") for the above referenced property Riverside County Assessor's Parcel No. (APN) 414-142-038 was approved for water service for the proposed parcel development as set forth in your "Will Serve Request" dated February 2, 2017 and associated project information provided as part of that "Will Serve Letter" request package which included Water Improvement Plans for Tract Map 33680 previously approved by the District.

The Beaumont Cherry Valley Water District will provide water service to the subject property for the development and associated water demand conditions set forth in the District's May 18, 2017 Staff Report related to this item, but not limited to, the Rules and Regulations Governing Water Service as amended by the Board of Directors from time to time.

Conditions of Development:

In the event the Board selects Option A, above, during the continued project development the following conditions must be met:

- The Applicant shall resubmit plans for update and subsequent District approval to show all existing easements, existing utilities, and to ensure the project meets current District Requirements.
- 2. The Applicant shall enter into a water facilities extension agreement and pay all fees associated with the domestic water services. The Applicant shall also pay all fees related to new fire service facilities including any facilities improvements that may be necessary to meet the fire flow requirements.

- 3. To minimize the use of potable water, the District requires that the applicant conform to the City of Beaumont and/or the County of Riverside Landscaping Ordinances which pertain to water efficient landscape requirements and the following:
 - a. Landscaped areas which have turf, shall have "smart irrigation controllers" which use Evapotranspiration (ET) data to automatically control the watering. Systems shall have an automatic rain sensor to prevent watering during and shortly after rainfall. Automatically determine watering schedule based on weather conditions, and not require seasonal monitoring changes. Orchard areas, if any, shall have drip irrigation.
 - b. Landscaping in non-turf areas should be drought tolerant consisting of planting materials similar to that at the District's demonstration garden at the Groundwater Recharge site. Irrigation systems for these areas should be drip or bubbler type.

The Applicant shall conform to all District requirements and all City of Beaumont requirements.

We look forward to working with you in the coming months and please feel free to contact the office should you have any questions.

SUBJECT: Update, Discussion and Consideration of Authorization of Engineering Services

for the Beaumont Master Drainage Plan Line 16 Stormwater Capture Project

Staff Recommendation

Consider authorizing allocation of funds for Design Engineering Services in an amount not to exceed \$50,000.00 for the Beaumont Master Drainage Plan Line 16 Stormwater Capture Project.

Background

In July 2017, the Beaumont-Cherry Valley Water District (BCVWD) Board of Directors conditionally approved a Cooperative Agreement between BCVWD and Riverside County Flood Control and Water Conservation District (RCFC&WCD) for the development of a storm water capture project to capture high quality storm water for recharge at BCVWD's Noble Creek Recharge Facility - Phase II Ponds (NCRF - PH II).

The Board requested that BCVWD staff work with RCFC&WCD staff to address BCVWD's concerns and finalize the Cooperative Agreement between BCVWD and RCFC&WCD. The specific BCVWD concerns included the following items:

- Section I, Item 7: BCVWD payment participation schedule proposed by RCFC&WCD in 2017 required BCVWD project cost sharing payment contributions to be made at 100% of BCVWD's 50% share of the Construction Cost.
 - RCFC&WCD has taken into consideration BCVWD's payment schedule and is incorporating said schedule into the agreement.
- Section II, Item 7: BCVWD's ability to participate in the change order approval process as
 the project advances to ensure BCVWD is provided the opportunity to weigh in on
 decisions made on change orders prior to potentially encumbering BCVWD with additional
 project cost.
 - BCVWD staff understands that RCFC&WCD will be adding language which should satisfy the concern brought forth by BCVWD.

BCVWD staff hopes to have a revised Cooperative Agreement from RCFC&WCD in-hand soon. Through the finalization process of the Cooperative Agreement, there will be close coordination between BCVWD staff and RCFC&WCD staff to ensure that the proposed changes are understood and acceptable.

Regarding the ongoing project status, RCFC&WCD has solicited and awarded consulting services for design of the RCFC&WCD portion of the project, and said design is at the 30% complete milestone. BCVWD has performed preliminary project work for its portion of the project and



anticipates moving the project forward more aggressively when the Cooperative Agreement is finalized and executed. On May 30, 2019 BCVWD staff met with RCFC&WCD staff and their design Consultant, JLC Engineering and Consulting, to discuss design concepts and status as well as issues both parties will need to consider as design moves forward.

In order to maintain the project cohesiveness and maintain the project design and construction schedule, BCVWD staff is reviewing the option of partnering with RCFC&WCD and leveraging their design Consultant for design and drafting support services. Based upon preliminary discussions with RCFC&WCD staff and their Consultant, the cost for said BCVWD related support services would likely not exceed \$50,000.

RCFC&WCD staff further indicated they would suggest amending their contract scope of services for the BCVWD work and add reimbursement for this work activity to the Draft Cooperative Agreement.

Summary

District staff is currently working with RCFC&WCD to resolve the comments and considerations conveyed by the BCVWD Board in July 2017 regarding the Cooperative Agreement. BCVWD staff has been working with RCFC&WCD staff to finalize the agreement. BCVWD staff met with RCFC&WCD staff regarding the status of the design component of the project. Both parties understand that this project is expecting to receive Proposition 84 funding contingent upon the project being substantially complete by December 2021.

BCVWD plans to present the final scope of services for design and drafting services from RCFC&WCD's consultant for review and consideration by the Board. If this data is available by the July 25, 2019 Engineering Workshop, this cost information will be provided at that time.

Fiscal Impact

As reported in July 2017, the BCVWD share of the construction cost is expected to range between \$1.39 million and \$1.89 million. This project is budgeted in the Capital Improvement Plan approved by the Board in December 2018.

Consultant design and drafting support services are estimated at an amount not to exceed \$50,000. A refined scope and fee will be brought before the Board when finalized.
